

Revenaugh, director of dance at CSA: ‘Changing minds’

Behind the Scenes features personal stories from people who work in important but often unrecognized roles in our community.—Ed.

Brandy Revenaugh, the director of dance at Marion Community School of the Arts, started dancing at age three and her feet haven’t stopped moving since. Her grandparents thought enrolling her in dance classes would help her become more outgo-

ing and make friends. Revenaugh said, “They were correct, and just like everybody else, I started with one class, and then two classes, and then I danced in a competitive team.”

While competitive dancing at Jamie Bragg’s Signature Dance Studio, Revenaugh said she knew she wanted to dance for a living. At age 16, she began teaching dance classes and realized how much she enjoyed teaching as well.

Revenaugh contin-



ued to teach full-time at Bragg’s studio for nearly two years before opening

Dancer’s Edge in August 2002, with 50 students ranging in age from six to 18. She ran Dancer’s Edge at 2701 W. Ninth St. for seven years before moving to a 5,000-square-foot warehouse at 3214 S. Poplar St., where the school remained for three more years.

In the summer of 2012, Revenaugh decided to merge her competitive dance company with The Community School of the Arts (CSA). “The face of my Dancer’s Edge changed with CSA. Competitive dance has become easier with the CSA Arts Academy. Dance is still expensive with competition entry fees, costumes, and travel expenses, but we have a passionate team ready to help our students. Kids being able to prepare for school while studying dance or their art form. All those helpful things have made the face of my company change over the past couple of years,” said

Revenaugh.

Revenaugh now works with four faculty members in the CSA dance program: Brooke Napier, Hailey Higginbotham, Kirston Hiller, and Emily Duke. Classes include hip-hop, ballet, contemporary, tap, jazz, lyrical, and other types of dance classes. Most classes begin at 5 pm, while private lessons can be scheduled earlier in the day.

Brooke Napier, the competitive dance company director, teaches all of the technique classes, student training, and private lessons. “Brooke’s choreography is nationally recognized. We’re all lucky that she’s in-house,” said Revenaugh.

To prep for a nine-month-long dance season, Revenaugh works year-round, spending her time contacting guest choreographers for workshops, selecting competitions, casting dance pieces, working with in-house

choreographers, speaking with parents, researching costumes, and teaching and training students.

The dance company often travels for competitions from New York City to Los Angeles. Their students have received scholarships to The Juilliard School, Joffrey Ballet of Chicago, Dean College, and more.

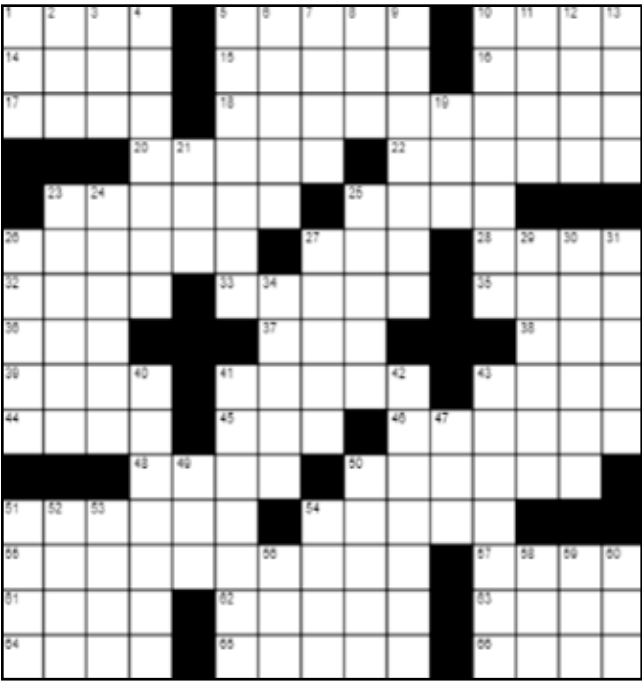

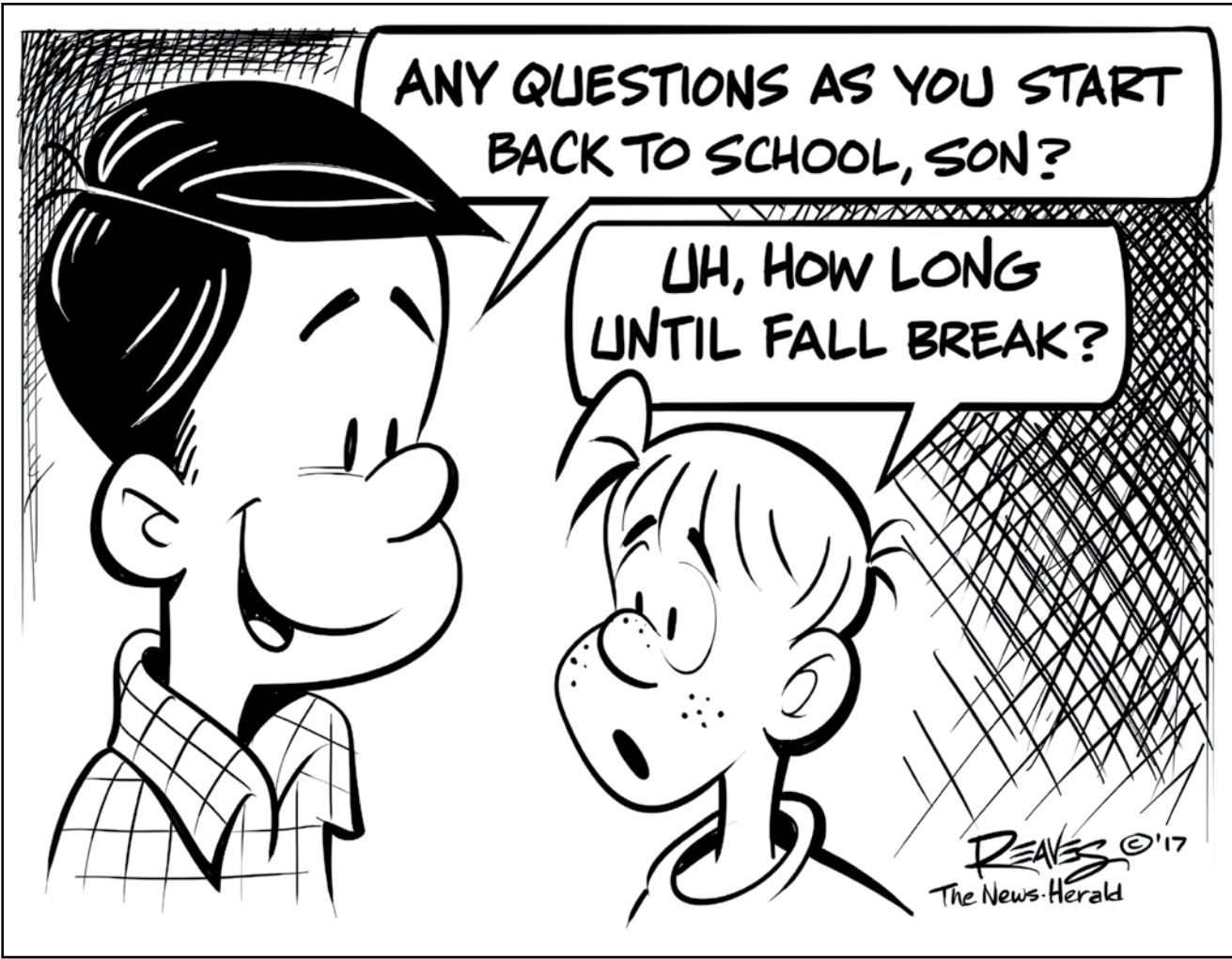

did that.’ I think changing their minds about what’s possible is one of my favorites,” said Revenaugh.

She also judges for other dance competitions and works with In10sity Dance and Hall of Fame Dance Challenge. “If I’m not here, I’m watching 800-plus acts of dancing and judging them,” said Revenaugh. “I enjoy the evolution of dance. The things that I was doing at the age of 16 compared to what dance looks like now is so different. Plus, it changes from location to location. I enjoy seeing what is popular here and what is popular in other states and on the other side of the country.”

When not working with dancers, Revenaugh said she spends time doing mom stuff. She and her husband, Matthew Revenaugh, were married on July 8, 2000. They have three children, Sydney, 15, Zoe, 13, and Maddox, 11.

Of course, all of their children dance, but Revenaugh said she does not teach any of their classes. “I don’t want to teach my children necessarily, or as little as possible, I just want to be their mom,” said Revenaugh.

Revenaugh graduated from Lakeview Christian School and studied at Indiana Wesleyan University, earning a degree in psychology in addictions counseling.

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


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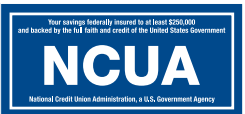

A ride across America: 'Keep the hammer down'

This summer, David Roorbach, an Indiana Wesleyan University alumnus (Class of 2014) and son of The News Herald's publisher is biking 4,200 miles across America with his friend Anthony Petrillo. They started in Yorktown, VA, on July 14 and are headed for Oregon. This is a journal of their travels.



A RIDE ACROSS AMERICA

After spending the first 12 days of the trip in Virginia, we've been zip-ping through states: a week in Kentucky, two days in Indiana, two days in Illinois, and now we've crossed the Mississippi into Missouri.

Getting out of Kentucky wasn't easy, however. Just as we were poised to cross the Ohio River I came down sick, and Anthony and I had to take a day and a half off of riding until I felt better. We checked into a motel near Louisville, where Anthony met a lady at the motel pool who offered to let us use a vacant apartment she had in town until I felt better. This is the kind of generosity of spirit we've encountered along the whole trip. We ended up taking her up on the offer, and the extra day of rest helped.

After a slow couple days, we busted out of Kentucky and rode 80 miles to Huntingburg, Indiana. We stopped at the Old School Café in town for dinner and Anthony asked

a hair-raising experience for a couple guys on nothing but bikes.

After we crossed the state line, traffic died down but the wind picked up. It was a frustrating experience to be going slowly down a flat road because the wind was knocking us back. I realized on that ride that there was no point in fighting the conditions. Other than the wind, it was a gorgeous day for a bike ride. Why get upset because it was a little slower than I wanted? I wasn't in a rush. I used a lower gear, turned on some music and had a pleasant ride into town.

One of the big anxieties before going on a freewheeling trip like this is figuring out where to sleep each night, but those concerns have faded as the trip has progressed. The Lord provides in different ways. The hardest night we've had so far was in Albion. We asked around town for a while and weren't making much progress. The pizza place owner said we could pitch a tent in the alley behind his building, so at least we had one option. One gentleman said we could bike 10 miles to the west and go to a church camp, but we didn't have the legs for it after an already long day. Finally, we asked a barista at a coffee shop, who called her mom, who then called her grandma, who let us use her cabin a mile outside of town. It was a

if anyone in the restaurant knew of a place we could camp for the night. Fortunately, one of the workers said we could camp in his yard just outside of town. We pedaled out to the property around 7:30 pm and were greeted by the restaurant owner, who let us use their shower; supplied us with Nutty Buddys, Gatorade, and protein shakes; and gave us wood to use for a fire out back. There are friends everywhere.

The ride from Huntingburg to Albion, Illinois, was tougher than expected. We encountered a road clogged with semi-truck traffic and a narrow shoulder, which was

perfect location, and we even had wood there for a fire that night.

The next day was our longest ride yet: 90 miles from Albion to Okawville. That morning, as we were about to head out, a man in a pickup truck asked us where we were heading, so we told him Oregon and chatted for a moment. Then he said "Well, I'm proud of you boys. Keep

the hammer down!" So that's what we did, all day.

The riding conditions were perfect: moderate temperatures, cloud cover, and minimal winds. Better get while the gettin's good.

The big 90-mile day set us up for an easier ride into St. Louis on August 6. Crossing the Mississippi River and seeing the Gateway Arch was a big moment. We had biked

that whole way. Yes, it was our legs that had done the pedaling, but it was God's providence, the support of our family and friends, and the assistance of strangers that had made it possible.

Next week: we'll be riding across Missouri and then into Kansas, where we'll be greeted by endless corn fields and (more than likely) plenty of headwinds. Each stage of the journey is different and I'm not sure it gets easier, but I can say that it has gotten more fun as we've gone along.

ruler, or crayons," said Root.

The Y event also offered free food—300 hot dogs plus sno-cones—and entertainment: a bounce house, dunk tank, and games. Plus, four beauticians and a barber volunteered to remain on site from 6-9 pm, giving approximately 75 children free haircuts. State Farm representative Nick McKinley and the Good Neigh-Bear also manned a booth to educate parents on car seat safety and embrace the upcoming school year with families.

"It was great to see so many different people from our community involved and spending time with their kids getting a haircut or burning off energy in the bounce house," said Root. "We just want to help as many families as we can in the best way that we can. We want families in our community to know that we are a resource for them."

Other back-to-school events were held with equal success throughout Grant County.

In late July, the Culture of Good, an employee-community give-back program of Verizon Authorized Retailer, TCC, gave 220 backpacks filled with pencils, paper, a pencil box, folders, and glue at two Grant County locations, 126 E. Main St. in Gas City and 1230 N. Baldwin Ave. in Marion. The events were a small part of the company's larger effort, the School Rocks Backpack Giveaway, which distributed 172,000 backpacks full of school supplies to youth across the nation this year.

The REAL Community Covenant Church, of Marion, hosted its first Blessings and Block Party and Mt. Olive United Methodist Church, of Sweetser, hosted its second annual Back to School Bash on Saturday, August 5, passing out backpacks filled with items from hygiene products to school supplies.

A Step Above Barbershop, of Marion, handed out nearly 200 backpacks with school supplies. The barbershop also offered haircuts all day on Monday, August 7, for an at-will donation to students.

The Community Foundation of Grant County, Project Leadership, and Affordable Housing Corporation partnered with Sunnycrest United Methodist Church (UMC) at 1921 W. Bradford St. in Marion to give away 100 backpacks filled with school supplies and healthy snacks in

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Sunnycrest Park, of Marion. Barb McClure, of Sunnycrest UMC, said they thought this would be an excellent way to highlight the park, which is available for public use, as well as host the community event. The cooperative event also provided opportunities for children to accomplish about 13 passport activities from the Grant County Passport Program, a list of 1,000 life experiences youth are encouraged to do before they graduate.

All events shared experiences of long lines that started forming hours before the event was scheduled to take place.

Another demand the Y aims to fill is before- and after-school child-care. With the support of contributors the Moorehead Family Foundation, the Community Foundation of Grant County, Marion Community Schools, Indiana Wesleyan University, the State of Indiana, and the Marion High School Alumni Association, both Live Y-ers and the Giant Discovery Zone, provide before- and after-school care for youth, under the guidance of the Y staff. Coming for Christmas: TX Roadhouse

A long-rumored addition of a steak house south on Marion's Bypass took a step toward reality Tuesday afternoon when the Marion Board of Zoning Appeals gave the go-ahead to the construction of a Texas Roadhouse restaurant at 4200 S. Western Avenue.

Jason Miller, representing University Marketplace, said

construction of the distinctively styled restaurant with the American and Texas flags atop the wood-sided building will begin "within a few weeks," and he said he expects the restaurant to be open by mid-December.

The restaurant is to be built on the property along the west side of Western Avenue in front of the strip mall that includes Meijer's, Hobby Lob-

by and Kohl's, among other retailers in the University Marketplace development.

The chain of steakhouse-style restaurants is headquartered in Louisville, KY, and country musician Willie Nelson is a part owner of the company.

The proposal had to be cleared by the zoning appeals board because the cedar wood-sided construction is a

variance from the approved zoning in the area. It received a unanimous vote from the four members of the appeals board meeting in the Marion Municipal Building.

Miller, who is associated with Randall Miller and Associates, Marion, said the approval Tuesday was the last hurdle and construction can begin without any other government approvals.

What's in a name? A victory, or maybe a memory?

A friend who shall remain nameless—and you'll soon see why—has taken, on occasion, to calling himself Stryker McGuire, a name he has appropriated simply because...well, because it sounds really cool. Much more cool than, say, Ed or Tim or Doug or Alan. Just the sound of it: Stryker McGuire.

Problem here is that there really is a man named Stryker McGuire, who is very successful, a native New Yorker who now

lives in London and once worked for Newsweek magazine and now for Bloomberg News. Second problem here is that really is his name. His parents so named him and sent him off into the world with a leg up on guys named Fred or Bruce.

Occasionally, when I'm driving interstate highways, I amuse myself by coming up with fictional detective names by reading the names of nearby towns on the exit signs and pairing them up. Best one I've come up with is

Darlington Mace, which, in real life, are small towns in Montgomery County along I-74, west of Crawfordsville. Now all I have to do is write a detective story in which Darlington Mace pursues the murderers, falls in love with the damsel and tools around town in a Lamborghini. Sort of like Lamont Cranston, or Phillip Marlowe or Easy Rawlins. Or, best of all, Nero Wolfe, who was created by the real Rex Stout, who was a Hoosier born in Noblesville.

The point, of course, is

that it's all in the name, even though the deeds of the man—or woman—sometimes overcome the name and become icons themselves. Take Dwight Eisenhower, for example. Neither name—"Dwight" or "Eisenhower"—is very sexy. But put 'em, together, toss in World War II and the American presidency, and you've got something. Although I don't recall many youngsters of my vintage being named either Dwight or Ike. Elvis? That's a different matter. And, among Hoosiers in recent years, Peyton has shown up from time to time. Wonder if anybody knows how many fifth grade boys in Indiana are named Peyton?

Some kids get named after battles. The former Marion lawyer who went on to become commissioner of Major League Baseball in the 1920s was named Kennesaw Mountain Landis. The commissioner was named by his parents to commemorate the battles of the father in the Civil War, Kennesaw Mountain among them. The mountain is in Georgia and the battle was fought as a part of the Atlanta campaign of 1864. His parents were named Abraham and Mary and he was born in Millville, Ohio, before the family moved west to Delphi and later

Logansport in Indiana.

Don't know of a lot of children named for Iwo Jima or the Bulge or Normandy in World War II, but the First World War, the Great War, produced a whole generation of walking war memorials.

Someone at the British Broadcasting Corporation did the research and found 1,634 British babies saddled with wartime names. Verdun, Ypres and Mons were common in England, if ever so briefly, in the 1920s. At least 166 were named Kitchener in

honor of the general, and, in 1918, 120 were simply named Victory.

Just last week, at a Marion restaurant, a pleasant young woman put the coffee cup in front of me and, when asked, said her name was Baylee. "Nice name," I said.

"Yeah," she said, "I'm named for the baby in the Oklahoma City bombing." That would be Baylee Almon, the one-year-old who became tragically famous for just a few minutes on the terrible day of April 19 in 1995 when the Murrah Federal Building in Oklahoma City was bombed.

Baylee is memorialized in the most tragic and iconic picture from that day.

The photograph by Charles Porter shows Baylee's body covered in soot, debris and blood as she's cradled in the arms of Oklahoma City firefighter Chris Fields.

A memorial that will live on for a long time, at least in the name of a pleasant young lady named Baylee working as a waitress right here in Marion, Indiana.

Ed Breen, co-host of "Good Morning Grant County" on WBAT radio, has been reporting on life in Indiana for more than 50 years. In 2016 he was inducted into the Indiana Journalism Hall of Fame.

ital plans, including financing mechanisms, and include them in the annual budgets, and create a strategy to absorb future circuit breaker losses.

Some of the proposed funding options include an additional local option income tax, which could generate an extra \$5.4 million per year, and payment in lieu of taxes (PILOT) from Marion Utilities, which would bring in an additional \$1.5 million annually.

Mayor Alumbaugh said he wants to keep the open

dialogue between the administration and local elected officials. "A big win for everybody last night was a better understanding of where we need to go and what we need to do," said Flynn. "We all agree we have a problem; it is how do we solve it with the least amount of impact on the citizens?"

The Mayor said he hopes to continue the open dialogue between their financial planner, the administration, and elected officials. "The more educated we all are, the better decisions we are going to make. We need to ensure they have the best information to make the best decisions," said Mayor Alum-

baugh.

In other local government meetings, the Marion Board of Public Works and Safety approved the termination of an Animal Care and Control officer, Jacob Detamore, on Monday, August 7, due to several behavioral incidents such as not taking care of the city-owned property and allegedly assaulting a citizen while using a city vehicle. Detamore was paid two weeks while on suspension. While the Board of Works moved to approve Detamore's termination, Board of Works member Alex Huskey said Detamore has the right to appeal the decision.

Ameresco presented plans

for renovations to the Grant County jail, juvenile detention center, and courthouse on Monday, August 7 to the Grant County Commissioners in the Grant County Council Chambers. The commissioners approved the near \$8 million of recommendations.

Additionally, the commissioners approved Marion Design Co. to continue operating at 302 S. Washington St. for another year. The IWU design and art company works in partnership with the City of Marion, local organizations, and leadership to empower residents through good design and experiences in the downtown grid.

A look at Grant County football this season

Eastbrook

Since he was hired as the head football coach of the Eastbrook Panthers in 1988, Jeff Adamson has molded the Panthers into one of the best football teams in Grant County, and in the entire state of Indiana.

Including last season, Adamson has won 12 sectional championships, four regional championships, two semi-state championships, 14 conference championships and has finished with six undefeated regular seasons. Along with that, the Panthers have

not had a losing season in 21 years.

Even with all those accolades and accomplishments, there is one major milestone that has dodged Adamson throughout his illustrious coaching career: a state championship.

After an incredible post-season run last season, the Panthers faced off against Indianapolis Cardinal Ritter in the state title game. However, a 72-yard touchdown run by Ritter on the first play from scrimmage set the tone and Eastbrook went on to lose, 28-6.

“It was tough from several

standpoints,” Adamson said. “It was certainly a huge momentum boost for them at the beginning of the game. It was definitely deflating for us. It was really tough when we watched the game film afterwards because we thought the [Ritter running back] was clearly out of bounds early in the carry and [it] just didn’t get picked up.

“We didn’t play our best in the first half, but we had a couple of opportunities to get it in right before halftime. We just couldn’t sustain anything offensively. They were really quick and big up front [so that] made it tough for our of-

fense to move the ball.”

Even after the tough loss in the state championship, the Panthers have the pieces to make another big run this coming season, as many key players will be back this season.

Jake Taylor, who was an all-state defensive tackle last year, will be back on the defensive line. Andrew Barajas, an all-state defensive back as well one of Eastbrook’s best offensive players, is fully healthy after playing through most of last year with a broken foot. Two major pieces of the offensive line, Matt Hollars and Jeffrey Duckwall,

are also returning. These four players, along with many others, give the Panthers a strong nucleus to build around as the season quickly approaches.

Most importantly, the team has been upbeat and positive throughout the summer, focusing on the upcoming season rather than last year’s state title game loss. Even so, Adamson knows that his team still has a lot of work to do, and, though it might be a cliché, he and his team will be focusing on one game at time as the season progresses.

“The important thing is that the guys really understand that you don’t get to pick up

this year where we left off last year,” Adamson said. “There were a lot of things that had to happen for us to be in a position to have a good run through the tournament. None of those games were easy; they were all very close games. So I think the guys understand that we really need to get back to work [for the upcoming season.]

“We can’t really talk about playing in a state championship game. We have to talk about playing Norwell first. That’s where it starts for us.”

Madison-Grant

In his second year as the Madison-Grant Argylls head football coach, Kyle Booher led Madison-Grant to a 4-6 record, which included big wins over CIC foes Blackford and Oak Hill. The team showed remarkable improvement, finishing with two more victories last season than they had in 2015 when the Argylls finished 2-8.

Last season, strong leadership from the senior class, together with a strong running game led by Luke Stroup, who ended his career as the third-leading rushing in Argyll history, were the two major reasons for the Argylls' success. However, poor defensive play, particularly in the tackling department, haunted Madison-Grant in many of their losses.

"We struggled defensively being on the same page and being all together to be in the right spots and [make the tackle]," Booher said. "We were pretty good at attacking the front side, but we were beaten a little too often on the cutback."

Along with that, the top three offensive players for the Argylls—Stroup, right guard Beau Bangle, who was a great run blocker, and Garrett Watson, Madison-Grant's starting quarterback—all graduated this past year, leaving some big holes on the offensive side of the ball. "[Those three players] were the [biggest keys] for us being able to run as well as we did last year," Booher said.

However, even with the loss of Stroup, Bangle, and Watson, Booher has high hopes for several incoming and returning players, including Tyrann Rodebaugh, who finished last season as an all-conference tight end. "He is one of those kids that works his butt off and makes things happen, so we are looking to get him a little more involved on both sides of the ball," Booher said.

Layne Parsons, who played left guard and defensive end last season, is another player that Booher expects to have a big season. "He had a pretty solid year at left guard last season, and he is probably going to shine on defense as well," Booher said. "He started to excel [on the outside] at the end of last year. We think he is going to start strong on both sides of the ball this year."

Dylan Brooks, a two-year starter at defensive back, will be Madison-Grant's No. 1 quarterback this coming season, and Booher believes that he will up for the task. "He's a great leader [and] he knows the footwork," Booher said. "He wants to make something happen every play and [doesn't] make very many mistakes."

In summer workouts, Booher and the team have been getting back to basics, working on proper tacking form as well as defensive formations in order to turn last year's biggest weakness into a strength. "[In the offseason] we have focused on tackling form [as well as] leverage," Booher said. "We also have

spent lots of time on simplifying the defense so the kids play faster, read the play quicker, and get to the ball as [quickly as possible].

"So [all in all,] we've been working with their tackling technique, adjusting their [shoulders for proper leverage], and [making sure] they are not overthinking things."

Heading into year three with a young team looking to make a mark in a competitive CIC, Booher is looking for his squad to consistently show improvement in all facets of the game as well as execute on both sides of the ball, particularly on defense, throughout the season.

"My expectation for this season is to keep on improving on what we are doing and [continuing] to do it better," Booher said. "Last year we did some things that were pretty new to all the kids and now they are getting the flow of it. The best way for us to [reach our goals] is consistent execution and finishing what we started."

Marion

Before Craig Chambers became the 22nd head football coach of the Marion Giants in December 2015, a team known for its storied football history had fallen into total disarray. In the three years previous, the Giants had won a grand total of three games under two different head coaches. However, under Chambers' leadership and guidance last season, the Giants finished with their best record since 2012, when the team won four games.

Though there was vast improvement, Chambers admitted that it took time for both the players and the coaches to become comfortable with one another. "The [toughest part about last year] was just being together for the first time," Chambers said. "It was my first year, we were learning a new offense, and we were trying to get [familiar] with one another. The first year is always an adjustment for a new coaching staff."

Even so, the Giants finally began showing unity near the end of the season, as players like Thomas Stone, Dontea Henderson, Xavier Fuller, and Tyrell Phelps took it upon themselves to be leaders on the football field. Unfortunately for the Giants, all four players graduated this past year. Henderson, Fuller, and Phelps are all committed to Indiana Wesleyan University, while Stone will be playing for Franklin College next season.

However, many key players will be returning for the Giants next season, including Justin Johnson, who will be the starting quarterback, and JK Thomas, who saw extensive playing time at running back and in the slot as a freshman. Chambers was effusive in his praise of Thomas. "He's

a dynamic kid as far as speed and quickness, and he has great hands," Chambers said.

Other players returning include Matthew Reynolds, whom Chambers called a "coach's dream," and Brayden Burke, who will see time on the offensive side of the ball along with his usual duties as the starting free safety.

All in all, while the group is relatively young, Chambers is already seeing major differences in this year's team during offseason workouts. "We have a lot of young guys coming up, so I'm excited to see how they are going to adjust just this season. This year, it seems like our senior class is going to start off leading right at the beginning. That's what we [as a coaching staff] are looking for and are excited about. When you have your peers holding you accountable, it makes a difference."

Chambers has already made the Giants a better football team in his short tenure. Now, heading into year two, he knows that the success of the Giants hinges on how well his young squad works together throughout the course of the season.

"We've put together a great staff, and the team looks pretty good so far [in offseason workouts.] Being as young as we are, it's [all going] to depend on how the team gels [as the year progresses.]"

Mississinewa

Last season, the Mississinewa Indians were a force to be reckoned with.

A potent offense led by all-conference quarterback Cade McCoin, do-it-all threat Heisman Skeens, and freshman phenom running back Cade Campbell, together with a tough and physical defense, helped the Indians breeze through the regular season, as they finished with an undefeated record. In all 10 of their victories, the Indians won by 20 points or more.

Unfortunately, injuries took their toll at the end of the year, and in the sectional semifinal, the Indians were blown out by Fort Wayne Bishop Dwenger, ending Mississinewa's season much earlier than many anticipated.

Fortunately for the Indians, their three major offensive pieces—McCoin, Skeens, and Campbell—are all returning. In fact, Head Coach Curt Funk believes that McCoin will be the key to the success of the Indians' offense this coming season. "Our offense is going to go as far as [McCoin] goes," Funk said. "We have high expectations for him."

Funk also sees an expanded role on offense for Campbell, who has shown continued improvement throughout the offseason after a strong freshman campaign. "Cade has put on 15 pounds since the end of

last season," Funk said. "He's gotten faster and stronger this offseason. We have high hopes for him in the running game, being a guy that can have 20-25 carries a game for us, because we feel like every time he touches the ball he is a threat [to score.]"

While the offense remains intact, the defensive side of the ball lost some key players that contributed to their success, including linebackers Costan Ormsby and Brad Pavay. "We've got some holes that we have to fill [on defense], so it's going to be a great opportunity for some younger guys to step up."

One of the players that Funk has effusive praise for is defensive tackle Weston Lockwood. Lockwood, who was a part-time player last season, has shined in offseason workouts, and Funk believes that he will have a much bigger role on defense. "Lockwood wasn't on the field full time last year, but this year he has put in the work. He's in shape, he's stronger, and we are really excited about him stepping up for us this [coming season.]"

With a team that looks to be excellent once again this coming season, Funk has two major focuses. The first is to win the CIC once again. The second is to compete for a sectional championship. With hard work and diligent preparation throughout the course of the season, Funk believes both goals are well within reach.

"Our number one goal this year is to win the conference and defend our title," Funk said. "Along with that, we want to win the sectional. We are in a different sectional this year. It's a tough sectional but we feel like [we have] a shot. We just need to get better every week so we can compete for that sectional championship."

Oak Hill

Last season, with only two major offensive starters, quarterback Adam McDivitt and fullback Noah King, and a plethora of younger, more inexperienced players, the Oak Hill Golden Eagles finished with a 6-5 record and a shut-out victory over Rochester in the first game of the sectional.

Through the ups and downs of last season, the Golden Eagles grew as individual players as well as a team. Unfortunately, for the second offseason in a row, Oak Hill is looking to fill holes across the roster vacated by a talented group of seniors.

"I feel like we made good progress, [but] we are kind of in that same position again," Ozmun said. "We are returning about half of our starters, but the group of seniors that made up the other half were big time contributors. We've got good guys coming back, and now we are looking for some key spots at quarterback, at fullback, at running back, at receiver, and at lineman. This year, we are kind of putting the puzzle back together."

Some of the pieces have come together in the early part of offseason workouts. Reid Newhouse, who spent last year playing tight end and

offensive tackle, is in the driver's seat to be Oak Hill's No. 1 fullback this upcoming season. Fullbacks are the main focus of Oak Hill's offense, and Newhouse's combination of size, speed, and strength could give the Golden Eagles a potent weapon on the offensive side of the ball. Other returning players include Eddie Overmyer, who was the team's starting center last season, and Wes Transier, who is competing for a running back spot after spending a few seasons on defense.

At the most important position on the team, the Golden Eagles have had a quarterback battle brewing all summer

long, as River Smith, who was the JV quarterback last year, competes with Landry Ozmun, who was the team's starting split end last year.

As of right now, neither player has an advantage.

"We consider it neck-and-neck right now," Ozmun said. "We've had a good summer with both of them getting a lot of reps. Neither one [played quarterback] last year."

In practice, Ozmun's focus has been on finding the players who he believes will be big contributors for the team this upcoming season.

"We are looking for an identity," Ozmun said. "Like I said, [we will] have a new quarterback, new fullback, new running backs, [and] a new receiver. We don't know

what our go-to play is or who our go-to players are, so right now, [we are looking to] see which players are coming to the top, who is making an impact, and who, at this early stage, is competing [hard] to win that position."

With a strong start, Ozmun believes his young team will be a force to be reckoned with as the season progresses.

"We are optimistic," Ozmun said. "We are going to be inexperienced, we are going to be young, [but] we have a really great group this year. We've got a team that is really positive and hard working. If we can figure out who we are and what we are good at early, I could see us competing for the conference [title] at the end of the season."

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
