The life and times of the Grand Hamburg

These are halcyon times for the tiny café at 122 W. Fifth Street. The little community gathering space recently became home of Miles-To-Go, a small carryout café.

The building once known not only for serving a delicious and cheap burger but also as the original Cheers of Marion, without the beer, continues to charm foodies in Marion-Grant County.

Once known to locals as the last place in Marion to buy an old-fashioned hamburger, the building has racked up several identities in previous decades.

First, The Grand Hamburg

packed the 16-by-24-foot rock building for more than 30 years in a classic diner setting with vinyl swivel bar stools and a gas-fired dry grill, and a little bell on the door to announce the arrival of patrons.

Mike Cline and Phil Witherow, former reporters for the Chronicle-Tribune, rated Grand's hamburgers as the best hamburger for 50 cents or less, but ranked the burger as eighth out of the 10 best burgers in Marion, due to its small size in comparison to other burgers sampled, which included Pena's, Little Italy, Nobby Grill, Marion Cafeteria, Rosie's Little Italy, Holiday Inn, Ponderosa, Edgewood Res-

taurant, and Mike's Little Naples (in order of rating), in an article published on April 18, 1976 in the CT Magazine.

After 50 years of molding and affecting young minds in the Marion community, JoEllen Shipman is retiring from McCulloch Junior High School.

Shipman, who grew up in nearby Alexandria and got her teaching degree from Ball State University, spent her entire career at McCulloch, teaching English and language arts for 40 years before switching to U.S. history and social studies for the final ten.

No matter what she taught, one thing was abundantly clear: Shipman was beloved by both students and faculty alike.

"JoEllen has the gift of teaching," McCulloch Principal Melissa Pogue said. "She has the love and passion for our students, and

February 22, 1862

The first group of Confederate soldiers arrives at Camp Morton prison in Indianapolis.



February 23, 1985

Bobby Knight, coaching the IU basketball team at Purdue, picks up a chair from the IU bench and tosses it across the playing floor. The incident ignites widespread national comment.

February 24, 1811

Henry Smith Lane was born in Kentucky. He later moved to Indiana where he practiced law, served as Governor for two days, and then was elected by the legislature to serve in the United States Senate.

February 25, 1779

George Rogers Clark captured Fort Sackville at Vincennes, marking the beginning of the end of British influence in America’s western frontier.

February 26, 1918

Otis Bowen was born in Fulton County. He became a physician and, after serving as Speaker of the Indiana House, was elected Governor in 1972. In 1985, he was appointed by President Reagan to serve as Secretary of Health and Human Services.

February 27, 1987

The West Baden Springs Hotel in French Lick was named a National Historic Landmark. Built in 1901, the structure has a free-spanning dome that at one time was the largest in the world.

February 28, 1893

The USS Indiana was launched in Philadelphia. 10,000 people were in attendance, including President Benjamin Harrison. The ship served in the Spanish-American War as part of the North Atlantic Fleet.

March 1, 1888

The Ball Brothers began glass production in Muncie. The company became famous for their glass canning jars and grew to become the largest producer of recyclable beverage cans in the world.

March 2, 1933

The Indiana Legislature adopted the cardinal as the official state bird.

March 3, 1934

John Dillinger escaped from the Crown Point jail, stole Sheriff Lillian Holley’s car, and headed for Chicago.

March 4, 1889

Benjamin Harrison took the oath as president of the United States. As he placed his hand on the Bible, he wore a top hat and a Prince Albert coat made for him by the A. J. Treat and Sons Tailor Shop at 24 N. Pennsylvania Street in Indianapolis.

March 4, 1902

The John Herron Art Institute opened in Indianapolis. In 1967, it became a school of Indiana University and, in 1969, a division of IUPUI.

March 5, 1860

Samuel Luther Thompson was born in Danville. He became one of the best baseball hitters in history. Inducted posthumously into the Hall of Fame in 1974, his RBI per game record still stands.

March 5, 1865

Indiana accepted the provisions of the Morrill Land Act, which led to the foundation of Purdue University. @LifeatPurdue

March 6, 1896

Al G. Field brought his production of “Darkest America” to the Elwood Opera House. This minstrel show was the first to use

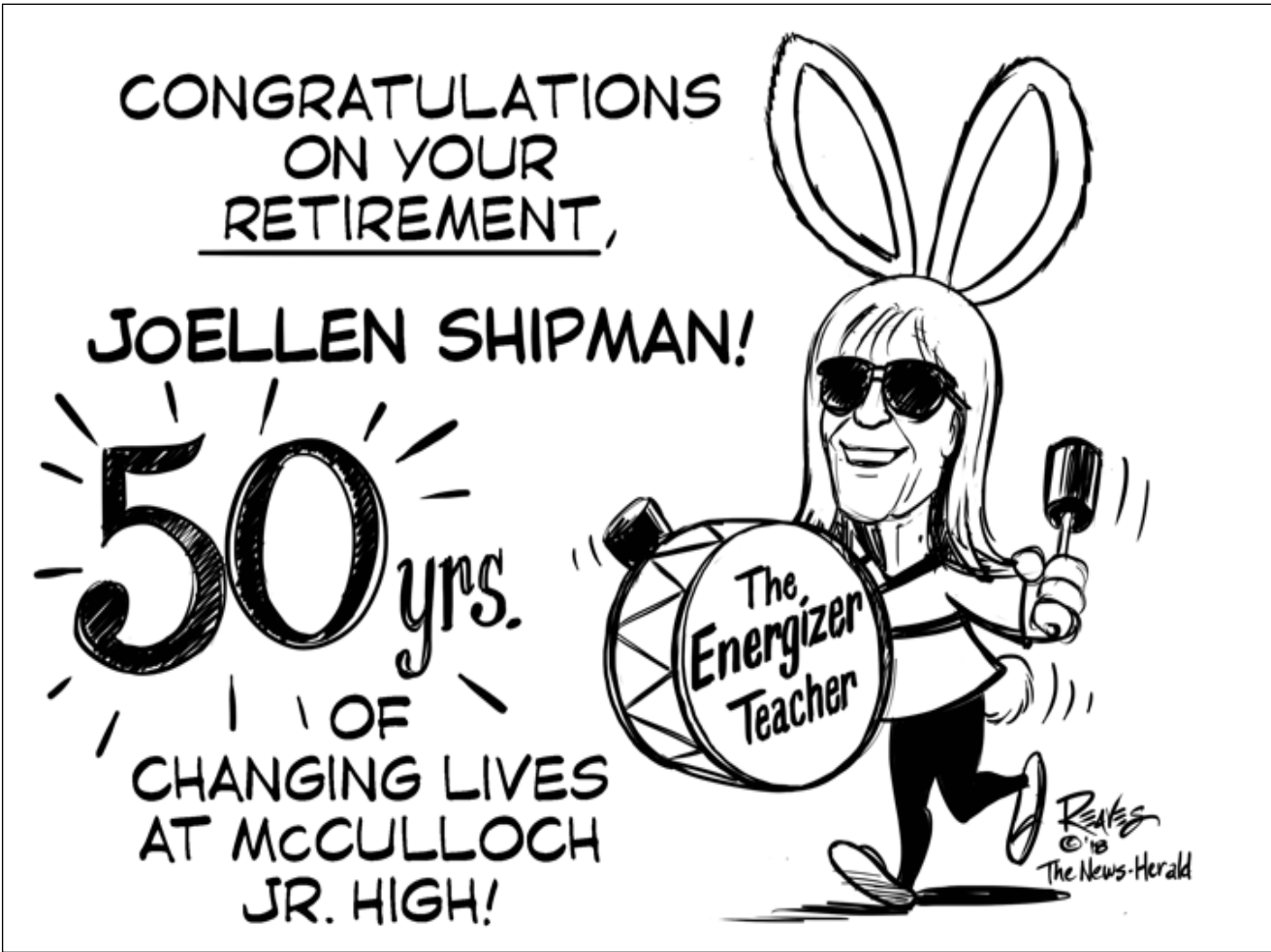

Legislature poised to legalize loansharking

A couple of quotes today to set the stage for one of the stranger aberrations in the state legislature this season. First from Niki Kelley, writing last week in The Journal Gazette in Fort Wayne: “Morality and capitalism are on a collision course,” she wrote, “as Indiana lawmakers look to legalize a new short-term loan option with rates that could venture into loansharking territory.”

The second comes from a reporter at the Indianapolis Star, writing about the action in the state House of Representatives: “The House passed the measure after Speaker Brian Bosma, who rarely votes on legislation, joined 52 other representatives in supporting the bill, despite his own church’s opposition. The bill now moves to the Senate.” And finally this from Matt Tully, the occasionally acerbic columnist at the Star: “There’s something broken at the Statehouse. Or maybe it’s something missing. A sense of basic decency, perhaps? Or priorities so out of whack that simple questions about things like humanity get pushed to the side?” “How else to explain the



success,” he asks “that a powerful group of lobbyists representing the payday lending industry are having on cruel, predatory legislation that would send interest rates soaring for some of the state’s most vulnerable residents. And I do mean soaring, beyond what most of us who have borrowed money could imagine. Soaring in ways that doom people to failure and seem intended to keep people locked in poverty.” There. That puts all of this into a little context. It started out as House Bill 1319, a piece of legislation introduced back in early January by Rep. Martin Carbaugh (Re-

publican, District 81), a piece of legislation that was on no one’s agenda for the betterment and welfare of the citizens of Indiana: not the governor, not the representatives, not the senators. But vote on it they did: 53 “yea,” 41 “nay.” Our gaggle of representatives--Kevin Mahan (Republican, District 31), Mike Karikhoff (Republican, District 30) and David Wolkins (Republican, District 18)--all voted “yea.” On to the Senate it went, where it now rests. There it is, a nifty bit of handiwork by the lobbyists who do the bidding of the payday loan industry, an industry which, not in-

cidentally, spent \$186,000 wining and dining legislators last year. Now, payday loans--those small loans, a few hundred dollars, at outrageous interest rates--have been with us a long time. What this bill would do is raise the amount that can be borrowed and permit interest rates that are off the charts...loansharking. It would allow storefront lenders to offer three- to 12-month loans of \$605 up to \$1,500 with annual percentage rates up to 222 percent. Under current Indiana law, conventional loan rates of more than 72 percent are considered felony loansharking.

That means borrowers would have to earn about \$23,800 a year to qualify for a six-month, \$1,500 loan. By the end of the loan, that borrower would end up paying \$2,378, according to an analysis by the Indiana Institute for Working Families. “I’m all for helping people, but this bill is helping no one but the companies that are going to benefit from these high interest rate,” Rep. Robin Shackleford (Democrat, District 98), said. Another Indianapolis Democrat summed it up nicely. Rep Carey Ham-

ilton (Democrat, District 87) said the payday loan industry argues that “there is a demand for the product.” Said she: “There’s always a demand for easy cash. That doesn’t mean it’s good.”

Giants, Indians snap losing streaks

County matchup

Eastbrook

After two strong outings against the Wes-Del Warriors and the Northfield Norsemen, the Panthers' short win streak came to an end on Tuesday night, as they dropped a tough 73-70 decision to the Wabash Apaches.

The game was close throughout, as neither team was able to pull away and create any separation.

But a couple of bad breaks in the final minute of the contest ultimately doomed the Panthers in the three-point loss.

"We had a pretty difficult call go against us with a little over a minute to go," head coach Brian Childs said after the disappointing defeat. "We had done a real good job of burning some clock and making free throws, so it was a tough break. They got the ball back, went down the court, and scored.

"We had a three-point lead, and they came down and missed a shot. Ryan [Mansbarger] took it the length of the floor and just missed the layup. [After that], they rushed the ball down the floor and hit a three in transition to tie it. All in all, they executed, and we didn't down the stretch. We gave them an opportunity, and they took advantage of it."

Mansbarger finished with a game-high 30 points on 60 percent shooting from the floor, while Capone Johnson added 26 points, four rebounds, and three assists in the loss.

Madison-Grant

The Madison-Grant Argylls came away with a dominant win on Tuesday night, using a quick-paced offense and an aggressive, ever-changing defense to come away with a 73-33 victory over Fort Wayne Smith Academy.

Offensively, the Argylls went with an uptempo offensive attack to keep Smith Academy's defense off balance. "We are able to get out in transition early," Head Coach Brian Trout said after the win. "Grant Brown did a really good job of looking down the floor and hitting

You could feel it the moment you walked into the gymnasium--the excitement, the anxiety, the energy, the focus.

It was senior night at Mississinewa High School, as players, band members, and cheerleaders were honored for their accomplishments in the realms of athletics, the arts, academics, and other areas.

It was the final home game for Thabit Gault, Elijah Bounds, Connor Wilson, Jerod May (pictured at right, shooting), Jalen Martin, and Trey Jones.

It will be one they will always remember.

Gault shined from start to finish, the defense rebounded after a couple of tough outings, and the Indians came away with a 68-52 victory over the Eastbrook Panthers on Friday night.

The energy that had been building throughout the evening came to a fever pitch at tip-off, as May, the Indians' leading scorer last season, made his first appearance of the season. The senior shooting guard tore his ACL in the offseason and was cleared earlier this week to resume basketball activities.

Energy like that can be contagious, and it certainly was for the Indians. With May running the floor, the Indians jumped out to an early 9-2 lead, which included six points from Bounds and a triple from Wilson.

On the other end of the floor, the Indians' defense clamped down on Ryan Mansbarger, one of the top players in Grant County and the leading scorer in Eastbrook history, holding him scoreless in the first eight minutes of the game. In fact, the Indians' defense held Mansbarger to just 10 points in the contest, well below his average of 25.6.

"We had a good focus," Mississinewa Head Coach Andrew Evertts said. "I felt like tonight every time we were yelling out on the bench what they were going to run, our guys responded and defended it well. I was really proud of

[our guys] defensively. To hold [Mansbarger] to 10 points says a lot because he is a good basketball player."

While the Indians' defense kept Mansbarger in check, the Panthers' defense had no answer for Gault.

After a scoreless first quarter, Gault netted 10 points in the second quarter to help the Indians build a 31-16 halftime lead. That was just the beginning.

Gault continued to be the offensive focus in the second half, and he continued to deliver from all over the floor. After hitting two free throws to start the third quarter, Gault hit his first triple of the contest to cap off an 8-2 run and give the Indians a 20-point lead.

The Panthers could not stop Gault from scoring, and they couldn't keep him off the glass, either. Gault finished with eight rebounds, several of which were offensive.

"We [just] had a hard time keeping [Gault] off the boards," Eastbrook Coach Brian Childs said after the game. "He just really went after it like a man tonight, and there were times when the guy blocking him out was the only guy going after the ball. That just can't be the case against a team like this."

The final quarter was more of the same, as Gault hit two more treys and the Indians led by as many as 27 before settling for the 16-point victory.

While Gault was the highlight of the night, May's debut was encouraging. In his first game action in almost a year, he finished with five points, eight rebounds, and a great assist to Bounds in the first quarter.

He was obviously rusty--a given with the fact that he has not played in months--but the more he plays, the more comfortable he will become. With sectional play just a week and a half away, he could be rounding into form at just the right



time. "I thought he played really well," Evertts said of May. "I thought he was more physical then he needed to be--we are going to have to tone that down a little bit--but he made good decisions, and he crashed the boards. His shot will come around. As he gets his legs under him, he will be a great shooter for us too."

On the other side, the Panthers, coming off a tough loss to Wabash on Tuesday, never seemed to be in the game. Capone Johnson and Bryce Schamber were the bright spots in the loss, as they each finished with 18 points, but

the Panthers never threatened the Indians' lead, and the intensity that they have shown in many of their contests this season just was not there on Friday night.

"We just didn't have the focus that we've had," Childs said. "It kind of looked like we got caught up in all of this--[their] senior night and May coming back. I knew it was going to be tough coming in here and starting four sophomores, but, at the same time, we have played against really good teams and have competed much better than we did tonight. I really don't have an answer as to why it happened, but it did, and we

have to fix it by Tuesday. We have to find some answers here and quick."

In a big rivalry game, the Indians showed that, when they are on, they are a tough team to beat.

Evertts' only hope is that their play from Friday night carries over into their last three regular season games, as well as the postseason. "We've got a lot more left," Evertts said. "That was my message to all those guys. We have three more regular season games, but we want to play deep into the tournament. If we play the way we did tonight, we are a team that could make a deep tournament run."—Sean Douglas

Howell and Rudy for some easy buckets."

While the offense was scoring points in droves, the Madison-Grant defense was equally impressive, holding Smith Academy to just eight points in the first two quarters.

Though they had a big lead after halftime, the Argylls kept the pedal to the metal the rest of the way, outscoring Smith Academy 43-25 in the second half to secure the 40-point victory.

"In a game like [tonight] sometimes, when you get up by 20 or 25, you lose all of your defensive intensity and things get sloppy, but we did not do that tonight," Trout said. "I thought we did a good job of keeping our intensity. We mixed it up a little bit, giving them different looks and not allowing them to settle in and get comfortable with what it was we were doing."

Wyatt Rudy led the Argylls in scoring with 20 points on six-of-13 shooting, while Kaden Howell finished with 13 points. Lance Wilson provided 12 points off the bench in the Argylls' victory.

The Argylls were unable to keep up their momentum on Saturday, as they were defeated by the Eastern Comets 67-48 to drop to 5-16 on the season. The Comets jumped all over the Argylls in the first half, outscoring them 36-13 in the opening two frames, including 16-2 in the first quarter of play.

The Argylls played much better in the second half, but the deficit was too much for them to overcome.

"We got off to a very slow start," Trout said. "And some of the things we didn't do well against Smith Academy on Tuesday were really exposed against Eastern. We didn't take care of the things we needed to be taken care of, and they really exposed us."

Now, heading into their last game of the season on Friday against Monroe Central, Trout is just looking for his team to start strong and play that way from beginning to end.

"We need to clear our mistakes up and get off to a better start," Trout said. "We wait until we are down to start playing hard and to get that urgency that you need to start the game with. Once you bury yourself by 10, 12 points before you finally start doing that, it's hard to dig out of a hole like that. We just need to focus more and get off to a much better start."

Howell finished with 14 points, while Wilson finished with nine points in the loss.

Marion

The Marion Giants' two-game losing streak came to an end on Friday night, as they defeated the Harrison Raiders in overtime, 83-77. With

the win, the Giants improved to 15-6 overall and 6-3 in the NCC.

Trailing 68-65 in the final moments of the contest, Marion freshman Jalen Blackmon, who hit the game-winning triple against Muncie Central back on February 1, hit the game-tying shot with five seconds to go to send the game to overtime.

The Giants went on to outscore the Raiders 15-9 in the extra session to secure the victory.

Mississinewa

Coming off of their resounding 68-52 win over the Eastbrook Panthers on Friday night (see box), the Mississinewa Indians continued to play excellent basketball the next evening, dominating on both sides of the ball once again in a 62-42 victory over the Bluffton Tigers.

Against the Panthers, the Indians used a combination of aggressive defense in the half-court and good shot selection from all over the floor to find success. On Saturday, they followed that same pattern against Bluffton with the same positive results.

"We defended the ball well, and we hit shots," Head Coach Andrew Evertts said. "I know that is what everyone is trying to do, but man, when we can do those two things, we can be a really good basketball team."

Spotlight game

Going against one of the top teams on their schedule in the Tipton Blue Devils, the Oak Hill Golden Eagles put together one of their best efforts of the season in 59-42 victory on Tuesday night.

The Golden Eagles imposed their will on both ends of the floor, scoring with ease against one of the top defensive teams in the state while playing some of the best defense that Head Coach Kevin Renbarger has seen in several seasons.

"Our kids played well on both ends of the floor tonight," Renbarger said after the game. "We executed on offense, and I felt like, defensively, we were as sound as we have been in the last two or three years."

The Golden Eagles stormed out of the gate in the first quarter, outscoring the Blue Devils 12-2 and taking a 14-4 lead into the second stanza. Caleb Middlesworth and Spencer Ballinger did most of the heavy lifting, combining for 12 of Oak Hill's 14 first quarter points.

The offense continued to hum in the second quarter, as the Golden Eagles outscored the Blue Devils 10-5

early in the period to give them a 24-9 lead.

Tipton's Carson Dolezal single-handedly kept the Blue Devils in the game with 10 second-quarter points, but the Golden Eagles kept finding holes in Tipton's defense and exploiting them, building a 31-19 halftime lead.

Middlesworth and Ballinger combined for 25 of Oak Hill's 31 points in the opening two quarters.

Though they played a great first half, Renbarger and the Golden Eagles knew they couldn't rest on their laurels. The Blue Devils have been one of the best third-quarter teams in the state this season, and they showed it once again on Tuesday night.

Dolezal and Lukas Swan were key in a 10-4 run that helped cut the Golden Eagles' lead to six.

That was as close as the Blue Devils would get, though, as Oak Hill's defense clamped down and got big stops when they needed to.

"Our kids knew how good of a team Tipton is, and they knew that they are a third quarter basketball team," Renbarger said. "They do a good job of

making adjustments, and then they come out and punch you in the mouth, and this team did. Swan and Dolezal hit some shots. Earlier in the year, our kids wouldn't have reacted very well to that, and I felt like they did tonight. I don't feel like they flinched at all. They hit some shots, but we came down, and in return, we hit some shots, settled in, and get some defensive stops."

The Golden Eagles cruised the rest of the way, leading by as many as 21 before ultimately coming away with the 17-point victory.

Middlesworth finished with 21 points, while Ballinger chipped in a double-double with 17 points and 11 rebounds for Oak Hill. Dolezal finished with 18 points to lead the Blue Devils.

For the game, Oak Hill shot a scorching 63 percent from the field.

Going against a quality team like Tipton, Renbarger couldn't help but be impressed with how well his team played on the defensive end.

"They're a team that does a lot of shot-faking, a lot of ball-faking, and

a lot of ball movement," Renbarger said. "They are very fundamentally sound, and they wait for you to break down. For our kids to maintain all of those defensive fundamentals was a credit to them buying-in to what they needed to do to win tonight. That team does not turn the ball over at all, ever, and we were able to get them to turn the basketball over."

"That's as sound as we have been on the defensive end all year."

With sectional play just around the corner, it feels like the Golden Eagles are starting to play their best basketball at the right time.

"We are getting consistency and effort in practice every day," Renbarger said. "Our practices have been top-notch for about a month now. We've gotten over illness. We've gotten past injury. We've gotten past things that keep kids from practicing. And we've got eight seniors playing with a sense of urgency."

streets became known as a gathering place over food and coffee, the Royal Grand Theatre, built in 1896 and razed in 1941, brought prominent entertainment to the site. The theatre closed in the 1930s, and about ten years later Stanley Stephenson and Willard Blackman purchased the land and built the little restaurant behind Hill’s Department Store (now Marion Housing Authority’s Centrum Mall).

Just two years in, Blackman sold his half of the business to Stephenson to focus on his service to the City of Marion as Mayor from 1948 to 1952 and 1957 to 1960. He died in 1991.

Stephenson’s wife, Mary, helped run the little restaurant for many years. Eventu-

ally, Stephenson also left the restaurant for public service in 1975 as city controller, assistant city clerk, and city auditor. He passed away at age 75 on Thursday, October 10, 1990.

Anyone who visited Grand’s between 1976 and 1992 knew “Lea” Leander Nichols, the manager and head cook. According to the Chronicle-Tribune, the business went up for sale at a listed price of \$25,000 in May of 1992, which was the time Nichols announced his retirement. In July of 1992, longtime patrons Mike Salter and Tom Stephenson dressed in black and white waitress uniforms and surprised the cook to help with the lunch rush and have some laughs.

The building continued to attract low overhead business enthusiasts and received its first significant renovation in 1993 under new owner

Jim Henry and his sisters, Mary Cornett and Wilma Couse, who helped to run the place. Henry purchased the building in December 1992 and installed granite tile, fresh paint and a new cash register, which replaced the pre-World War II cash register of Grand’s.

The building stood vacant for a few years, until Matthew and Melissa Spencer leased the small eatery from Sylvia and Dick Gerhart in September of 2001, saving the building from demolition and giving his father, Fred Spencer, a chance to operate another restaurant in Marion. Fred also managed the Lagro Café, Trading Post and the Southside Diner, Marion. He allowed smoking in his establishments, which he believed was the cause of increased business by 25-30 percent, according to a story in the Chronicle-Tribune,

August 18, 2002.

Not long after, the small restaurant received another update and new leadership: Libby Thompson. She named the place Libby’s Café and opened in late August 2005, featuring troll burgers, which are sliders with diced onion and pickle on a mini-bun. Then there was The Chicago Dog in the years 2013-2014, then, once again, the building sat empty.

Until Margaret Miles, a former Grant County Probation staff member for eight years, discovered the building was for sale. While she never visited Grand’s, she understands first-hand the need for more food establishments in the downtown grid, and the building’s small size and history made the deal even more attractive.

The new business opened in January 2018 and worked with Kayla Johnson, execu-

tive director of Main Street Marion.

“Margaret Miles and family have invested many hours into restoring and fixing up the space on Fifth and Boots streets. They have worked tirelessly to create a clean, welcoming, and family-friendly environment for dining in downtown. Their determination for success has been evident in the development of this space over the last six months,” said Johnson.

While the outside is much the same, the inside has been transformed from the Normal Rockwell diner to a modern, tiny inspirational café.

Regular hours are 10 am to 3 pm, Monday through Friday. The building is small, with limited seating; however, Miles said: “We have put a lot of hard work into the inside to transform the space into a comfortable, in-

venting and smoke-free atmosphere.”

Miles said they are focusing on high-quality prepared foods, easy to pick-up and carry out during breakfast and lunch hours to accommodate the downtown Marion workforce and patrons.

The café experienced an icy start in early January with freezing elements but opened as planned on Monday, January 8.

After spending 18 years as an engineer in North Carolina, Miles moved back home to Marion to be with family and pursue her dream to open a restaurant. Her daughter Monica Miles and step-daughter Nicole Pettiford help run the place, and they all practice active listening to provide a menu that meets the demands of their customers.

Trojan women win twice, men drop a pair

Men’s Basketball

It was a high scoring affair, as two of the top offenses in the Crossroads League battled it out for four quarters and an overtime session, but the Huntington Foresters came out on top, hitting a three at the buzzer to come away with a 102-99 overtime win over the Taylor Trojans on Tuesday night.

The Foresters came into the game averaging close to 90 points a game over their last eight contests. The Trojans, on the other hand, have averaged 91 points a night in their last three outings. Both teams continued to operate at a frantic pace, as they combined to put up 157 field goal attempts, including 52 looks from beyond the arc.

Taylor had the advantage early, shooting 50.0 percent from the floor to build a 43-27 lead with 3:13 remaining in the first half. The Forester scored nine-straight points to cut Taylor’s lead to three, but Jake Heggeland scored right before halftime to give the Trojans a 47-42 lead.

The Trojans extended their lead to nine in the beginning of the second half, but the Foresters responded with an 8-0 run before eventually taking the lead with 8:46 to play. The Forester continued to shoot well throughout the second half, sinking 51.2 percent of their shots while building an 86-78 advantage with 2:35 remaining in the contest.

Trailing by seven points with 44 seconds left, Ryan Robinson and Mason Degenkolb scored seven straight points for the Trojans to send the game to overtime.

After the Foresters built a 99-95 lead in the overtime period, Heggeland and Degenkolb each scored to tie the game up once again with six seconds left. But Huntington’s Mike Bush hit the game-winning triple from deep three-point range to hand the Trojans the crushing loss.

Heggeland finished with a career-high 28 points on nine-of-12 shooting to go along with nine rebounds and two blocks, while Robinson finished with 23 points, five assists, and two steals. Degenkolb added 19 points and six rebounds in the Trojans’ loss.

In the Trojans’ final game of the regular season, Evan Crowe became the 40th player in Taylor men’s basketball history to score 1,000 career points in a 103-90 loss to the Grace Lancers on Saturday afternoon.

The junior shooting guard scored a season-high 30 points in Taylor’s loss, sinking 11 of his 17 shots and six-of-nine from beyond the arc. Along with being 40th on TU’s all-time scoring list, Crowe moved into sixth place in program history with 214 made triples.

Most of Crowe’s points came in the second half, as he netted 22 on eight-of-10 shooting over the final 20 minutes of the contest. Crowe scored 20-of-22 for the Trojans from the 8:52 mark to the 4:25 points of the final period to keep the Trojans close, but the Lancers scored 60 second-half points on 19-of-29 shooting to secure the victory.

Jake Heggeland finished with 20 points and three blocks, while Tim Fleming scored 14 points off the bench.

Taylor will face cross-county rival IWU in the Crossroads League Tournament Quarterfinals on Wednesday evening.

Women’s Basketball

The Taylor Trojans came away with a victory in their final regular-season home game on Wednesday night, securing a sweep of Huntington University in a 69-51 triumph.

The Trojans made five of their first six shots from the floor to take an early 13-3 lead, but the Trojans struggled the rest of the first quarter, making just two of their final 10 shot attempts. With Taylor struggling offensively, the Foresters were able to cut the lead to 15-13 heading into the second quarter.

Taylor found its footing once again in the second quarter, using a 15-5 spurt to take a 30-18 lead at the 3:51 mark on their way to a 33-23 halftime lead. The Trojans hit four of their nine three-point attempts in the frame to help build their 10-point advantage.

The Trojans went on another run early in the third quarter, scoring the first eight points of the period to take a 41-23 lead. Leading by double digits heading into the final quarter, the Trojans used a final 10-3 surge to take a game-high 23 point lead before cruising to the final 69-51 tally.

For the game, the Trojans shot 46 percent from the floor while holding the Foresters to 33.3 percent, well below their average of 44 percent. With the victory, the Trojans tied the program record for most league wins in a single season, and their 20 victories is the most since recording 21 wins during the 2012-2013 season.

Kendall Bradbury led the Trojans in scoring with 23 points, her 25th 20-point outing of the season, to go along with six rebounds, while Cassidy Wyse scored 12 points on six-of-12 shooting from the floor. Aubrey Wright chipped in 11 points, four assists, and three rebounds in the Trojans’ victory.

On Saturday afternoon, Bradbury scored 23 points and broke TU’s single-season scoring record in a 76-61 victory over the Grace Lancers. Bradbury’s 695 points broke Liz Plass’ record of 680 set back during the 2003-2004 season.

the game, as IU Southeast scored two runs in the top of the first and tacked on two more runs in the top of the third for a 4-1 advantage.

Taylor cut the lead to 4-3 in the fourth inning. After Brett Lawson and Josh Lane reached on walks and Tanner Kolbe advanced them both with a base hit, Adkins hit a one-out single to score Lawson and Lane and cut the deficit to one run.

However, IU Southeast cruised the rest of the way, taking advantage of a couple of TU errors for three runs in the sixth inning and tacking on insurance runs in the final two innings to secure the victory.

The Trojans collected seven hit and six walks, but left 10 men on base in the loss. Along with that, Taylor pitchers combined for 14 strikeouts, but gave up three home runs.

Nathan Targart, Sam Wiese, and Lawson each recorded two hits, while Wyatt Whitman was walked twice, and Adkins had two RBI.

The Foresters came into the game averaging close to 90 points a game over their last eight contests. The Trojans, on the other hand, have averaged 91 points a night in their last three outings. Both teams continued to operate at a frantic pace, as they combined to put up 157 field goal attempts, including 52 looks from beyond the arc.

On Saturday afternoon, Taylor’s offense exploded for 11 runs on 15 hits, while Matt Patton was dominant on the mound in the Trojans’ 11-1 victory over Saint Ambrose University.

The Trojans scored runs in each of the first three innings, but blew the game wide open with five runs in the bottom of the fifth inning, all of which came with two outs. Lawson crushed a three-run shot and Whitman followed with a two-run blast to secure the victory.

Patton (3-0) needed just

51 pitches to breeze through five efficient innings, recording seven strikeouts and allowing just two hits.

Tucker Waddups and Brenden Bube combined for a stellar four innings of work, hurling a combined 12 strikeouts while allowing just five hits.

Whitman finished with three hits, two runs scored, and two RBI, while Adkins came away with two hits and two runs scored. Lawson finished 2-for-5 with a home run and four RBI in the Trojans’ victory.

Dale Wise hit a short jumper with seconds remaining to give Marion a 59-57 six-overtime win over Kokomo Haworth in junior varsity action. Regulation ended 40-40 and the overtimes 44-44, 46-46, 50-50, 50-50, and 54-54. Joe Andrews had 14 points, Rick Jones 13 and Todd Kirkfield 12 for Marion.

Bob Wright shot 727 and Peggy Lyons 618 to lead the men and women in county bowling.

Men take Crossroads title, women keep winning

Men's Basketball

On Tuesday night, Joel Okafor and Kyle Mangas each missed potential game-winning three-pointers in the final seconds, as the IWU Wildcats were upset by the Mount Vernon Nazarene University Cougars, 83-81. Okafor's attempt hit the back of the rim with four seconds left, and Mangas' desperation shot fell harmlessly to the floor just moments later.

With the victory, the Cougars swept the season series with the Wildcats, having also defeated them at Luckey Arena, 84-79, back on January 3.

IWU held a 52-40 lead, its largest of the night, in the second half, but the Cougars were able to erase that deficit and secure the victory. The game featured 13 ties and nine lead changes, which included 10 ties in the second half.

Mangas led the Wildcats in scoring with 24 points on nine-of-19 shooting, while Evan Maxwell finished with 19 points on eight-of-14 from the floor. Ben Carlson added 13 points and seven rebounds in the Wildcats' loss.

For the ninth time in the last 12 seasons, the Wildcats finished as the Crossroads League champions, defeating the Spring Arbor Cougars 77-51 in their final regular season game of the year.

With Bethel College's upset victory over the Saint Francis Cougars, the Wildcats secured the outright title.

The Wildcats trailed 25-21 with 6:23 remaining in the first half, but a 42-8 run in a 15:43 span gave the Wildcats a commanding 63-33 lead. In that same stretch, the Cougars went 9:40 without a field goal.

"We struggled early, and I think that was some nerves," Head Coach Greg Tonagel said. "We didn't come out offensively like we have lately. But we settled in, and I think over time our consistent effort on defense really paid off."

Mangas led the Wildcats with 27 points on 11-of-19 shooting, while Maxwell finished with 16 points and eight rebounds. Canaan Coffey added nine points, three rebounds, two assists, and two steals, while Joel Okafor added eight points in the victory.

The Wildcats are the No. 1 seed in the Cross-

roads League tournament and will host cross-county rival Taylor University in the quarterfinals on Wednesday night.

Women's Basketball

The IWU Wildcats continued their defensive dominance on Wednesday night, holding the Mount Vernon Nazarene Cougars to 28 percent shooting from the field, including 14 percent from beyond the arc, to come away with a 68-48 victory.

In their last three games, all wins, the Wildcats have held their opponents under 35 percent shooting.

On the offensive side, senior Anna Imhoff recorded her 1,000th career point in the game and has scored 495 points this season alone.

"[I'm] always happy with a league win on the road," Head Coach Ethan Whaley said. "I thought

we played tough in spurts, and it led to big runs for our team."

Imhoff ended the game with 20 points, including 18 points in the first half, to go along with seven rebounds. Nicole Ignasiak and Elaine Ededua each finished with nine points and a combined 11 rebounds, while Carly Lange added six points, nine boards, and three assists in the Wildcats' victory.

In the Wildcats' final game of the regular season, seniors Imhoff and Brittany Washington shined in a 71-45 victory over the Spring Arbor Cougars on Saturday night.

Once again, the defense was nearly impregnable, as the Wildcats held the Cougars to 27 percent shooting and forced 21 turnovers.

"I loved our toughness and grit on the defensive end," Whaley said. "We were disruptive and finished plays for 40 minutes."

Offensively, the Wild-

cats dominated in the paint, outscoring the Cougars 48-8 in the contest.

Imhoff led the Wildcats in scoring once again, finishing with 18 points on seven-of-14 from the floor.

Baseball

The Wildcats came away with their second doubleheader split of the season on Tuesday afternoon, defeating the Shawnee State Bears 8-1 in the first game before dropping a 5-3 decision in the second contest.

In game one, second baseman Judah Wollenburg had a big outing at the plate, finishing 3-for-3 with a home run and five RBI. Wollenburg hit a RBI single in the second inning and a grand slam in the sixth inning to blow the

game wide open.

Jacob Gividen (1-0) earned his first victory of the season, throwing four innings of one-run ball while striking out two and allowing just three hits in the victory.

In game two, Caleb Eder hit an RBI single in the second inning to give the Wildcats a 3-2 advantage, but the Bears scored three runs on a hit, four walks, and an error to take a 5-3 lead they would not relinquish.

Cameron Harvey (0-1) took the loss for the Wildcats, giving up three runs (two earned) and three walks in just 0.2 innings of work.
