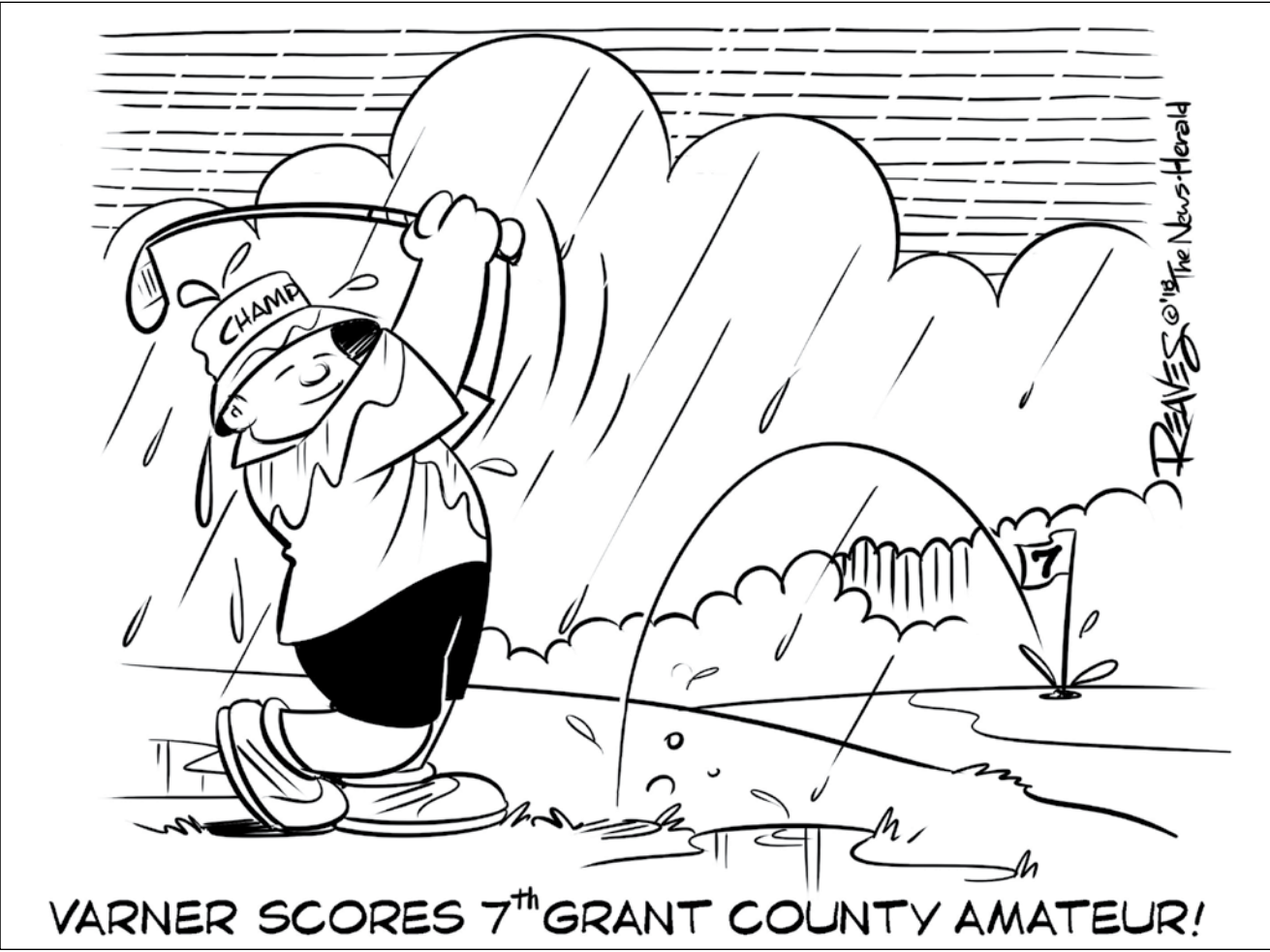

(D) an amount prescribed by the county auditor that equals the sum of:

(1) thirty-five dollars (\$35) for postage and publication costs; and
(2) any other costs incurred by the county that are directly attributable to the tax sale; and
(E) any unpaid costs due under IC 6-1.1-24-2(c) from a prior tax sale.

No property listed below shall be sold if, at any time before the sale, the Total Amount for Judgment is paid in full. Gaining a solid understanding of anger

26 *Be ye angry, and sin not: let not the sun go down upon your wrath:*

27 *Neither give place to the devil.*

—Ephesians 4: 26, 27

The study on anger is an interesting one for me. In the last two articles we have tried to lay the groundwork for a solid, working understanding of anger. The Scripture says,

“Be ye angry, and sin not: let not the sun go down upon your wrath: Neither give place to the devil” (Ephesians 4:26, 27). Paul’s letter to the Ephesians is one of the most practical writings of the New Testament. Chapter four gives us down-to-earth advice about the problem of anger. We want to make three valuable observations that the text gives:

1. Anger is a God-given

There have been lots of times that I believed that the only right thing to do was to give someone a piece of my mind. In reality, I don’t have much to spare, so I need to guard my mind.

emotion.

When it comes down to it, how much do we really know about ourselves? The word “emotion” encompasses a broad range of feelings, behavior and

changes in the body and mind. The basic emotions are joy, trust, fear, surprise, sadness, disgust, anger, and anticipation. Just as God has given us the emotion of joy, He has also given us the emotion of anger. We believe there is something wrong with the one who never displays any of these emotions. Remember, the text says, “Be ye angry.” Now don’t let this be your ticket or excuse for your anger.

2. Anger is not necessarily sinful.

The Scriptural text is qualified, “Be angry, and yet do not sin.” There are times when anger is appropriate; however, the problem arises when anger controls us instead of us controlling it. We should never let it come to the point of sin. The experiences of life ought to help us know if we are even coming close to crossing the line of sin.

3. Anger must have safeguards.

Paul stresses that we shouldn’t “let the sun go down on our wrath.” You may be wondering, what does this mean? Just what it says. Prolonged anger simply gives the devil an opportunity to work in our lives. He wants us to be angry to the fullest extent. How do we deal with this issue? Don’t prolong anger into the night. In Paul’s day, the day ended at the setting of the sun. We should never sleep on wrong feelings. Forgiveness must be in our hearts at day’s end. The lack of forgiveness reveals the pride of life that must be dealt with.

Another preventative is we must not express our anger in such a way that we are weakened and the devil gets an upper hand on us. There have been lots of times that I believed that the only right thing to do was to give someone a piece of my mind. In reality, I don’t have much to spare, so I need to guard my mind. The majority of times that I have told someone has only led to me asking them to forgive me.

For three weeks we have waded through these thoughts on anger, and I’m

sure it is a tough pill for some to swallow. Anger doesn’t have to control us. We can actually overcome anything through Christ. I am sure of one thing after this series: when I leave this world I don’t want to be remembered for my temper. As much and often as I fail, I would like to be remembered for the love of Jesus. Three harsh Pence biographies will garner attention

Now, how’s this for getting our attention? It comes from Sunday’s New York Times piece by Frank Bruni, his editorial page column titled simply “Mike Pence, Holy Terror”: “There are problems with impeaching Donald Trump. A big one is the holy terror waiting in the wings,” he writes. “That would be Mike Pence, who mirrors the boss more than you realize. He’s also self-infatuated. Also a bigot. Also a liar. Also cruel.

“To that brimming potpourri he adds two ingredients that Trump doesn’t genuinely possess: the conviction that he’s on a mission from God and a determination to mold the entire nation in the shape of his own faith, a regressive, repressive version of Christianity. Trade Trump for Pence and you go from kleptocracy to theocracy.”

Got to admit, nothing wishy-washy. You know where he stands. The cause of this little outburst is his reading of early pages from a book about Pence that’s to be out this week. The book, “The Shadow President: The Truth About Mike Pence,” by journalists Michael D’Antonio and Peter Eisner, is one of three that are going to focus on Pence and his agenda in the days and weeks very soon.

Another, tamer, calmer and a whole lot closer to home comes also this week from Andrea Neal, a natural-born Hoosier whom many of us have known for, well, for a very long time. Maureen Groppe at the Indianapolis Star got a look at this volume and gives us the summary:

“A new biography of Mike Pence opens by calling him a paradox and closes by describing his ‘biggest enigma’ as vice president.” Groppe write of Neal’s book—a volume titled “Pence: The Path to Power.”

“How could a biblically based Christian so readily align himself with a man prone to flout the most recognized rules of civility?” Neal asks.

Groppe hedges on whether or not she found the answer: “While Neal leaves the answer to that question to the reader, the biography provides a good overview of the path the politically ambitious Pence took to get to his current position.”

Yet a third book focusing on Pence is coming soon from Tom LoBianco, late of the Associated Press here in Indiana. The name may be familiar because it was he who, as a young reporter, took the first serious look at how Wayne Seybold was running the mayor’s office

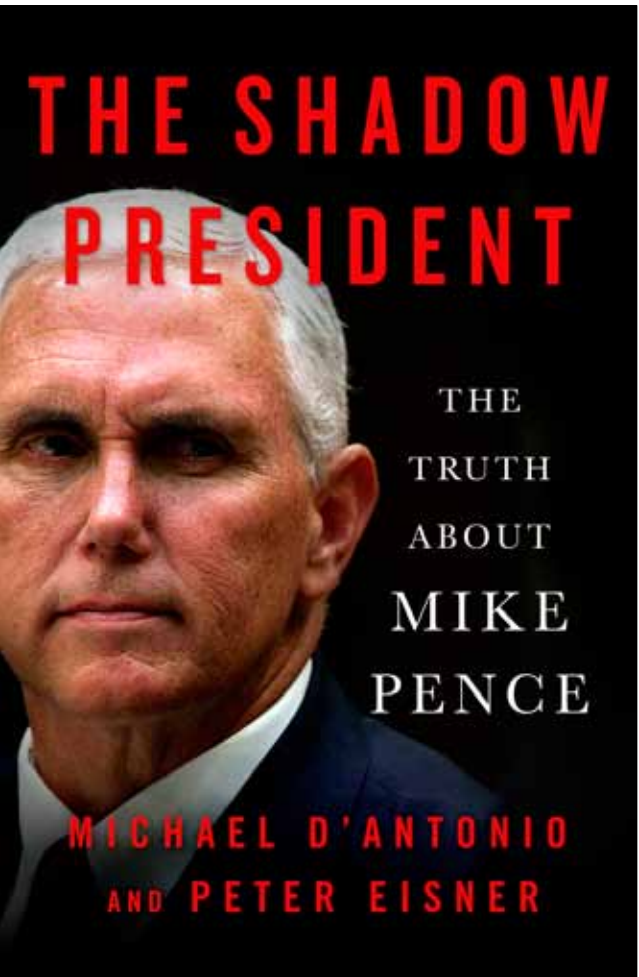

in Marion a few years ago.

Says LoBianco in his book, “Pence is basically running the donor maintenance to the White House. My reporting is he also runs donor access to the White House. He’s the gatekeeper. Trump doesn’t like do-

ing that stuff. He used to be a donor himself. My understanding is that this is something Pence has been doing for 30 years. When you have the vice president running all the donor maintenance, the political operation, the mid-terms,

going out there campaigning heavily, he does have a natural role and it is extremely political in this White House.” No date yet on when LoBianco’s book will be available.

Certainly the book that will get the most attention is the harshest. That’s the way we are with our politics and politicians. Give us the dirt and we’ll chase it. Anyway, in their book, D’Antonio and Eisner are pretty harsh, even if factually correct.

Says the Times columnist, “the book persuasively illustrates what an ineffectual congressman Pence was, apart from cozying up to the Koch brothers, Betsy DeVos and other rich Republican donors; the clumsiness and vanity of his one term as governor of Indiana; the strong possibility that he wouldn’t have won re-election; his luck in being spared that humiliation by the summons from Trump, who needed an outwardly bland, intensely religious character witness to muffle his madness and launder his sins; and the alacrity with which he says whatever Trump needs him to regardless of the truth.

“In Pence’s view, any bite marks in his tongue are divinely ordained. Trump wouldn’t be president if God didn’t want that; Pence wouldn’t be vice president

if he weren’t supposed to sanctify Trump.”

“People don’t understand what Pence is,” D’Antonio told Bruni. Which is? Says reporter D’Antonio “A religious zealot.”

Oak Hill celebrates state title, passes out rings

Saturday was a special night for the Oak Hill community, as Head Coach Kevin Renbarger and the 2017-2018 Class 2A state champion Golden Eagles, in the midst of family, friends, and basketball alumni, received their state championship rings, etching themselves into basketball immortality.

However, it went much deeper than that. It was not just a celebration of the first state championship basketball team in school history. It was a celebration of the history of Oak Hill basketball.

Led by Head Coach Phil McCarter, the Golden Eagles won three sectionals in the first three years of the school's existence, establishing a winning culture that has been passed down throughout the 59-year history of Oak Hill. Before this season, the Golden Eagles had won 25 county championships, 17 conference titles, eight sectionals, and two regionals. Yet for all of their success, one goal remained elusive until March 24, 2018: a state title.

And though they eventually reached the top, they had to spend some time at the bottom.

In the single-class basketball era, Monte Towe led the Golden Eagles to the semi-state game in 1971, where they lost to Elkhart. The Golden Eagles returned to the semi-state in 2001, but again they were defeated.

More recently, in 2016, the Golden Eagles dropped a heartbreaker on a last-second shot to the Lapel Bulldogs, who went on to win the state championship that season. But, as all good teams do, they over-

came adversity, culminating the best campaign in school history with a 56-44 victory over the Forest Park Rangers at Bankers Life Fieldhouse.

McCarter, now in his late 80s, looked back on his time at Oak Hill with fondness. "It's always fun for me to return to Oak Hill," he said. "I spent the most enjoyable years of my life teaching and coaching here. I would like to thank the Oak Hill community, faculty, and especially the players who made my tenure successful."

McCarter stressed the word "togetherness" in his brief speech, stating that everybody, coaches included, worked as one cohesive unit during his coaching career, which led to consistent success. He hopes that will continue in the future. "The players, coaches, students, and the entire community will cherish this accomplishment forever," McCarter said. "I would challenge Oak Hill to continue their togetherness."

Jarrad Odle, the all-time leading scorer in Oak Hill history with 1,465 points, a member of the 2002 national champion runner-up Indiana University Hoosiers, and the Golden Eagles' color commentator on the radio, spoke briefly on what this state championship win means to the alumni and the community.

"I am a little jealous," Odle said. "Not a bad jealousy, but a jealousy where I wish that I had accomplished something like that. But in all sincerity, that jealousy turned into complete pride. This group of men has brought so much pride and joy to many generations of Oak Hill players, coaches, and managers. We all lived our

dream through you guys."

While Odle and his family do not live in Grant County anymore, his heart will always be in Converse. "Even though I am raising my kids in a neighboring county and a neighboring school system, I will never waver from calling Oak Hill home," Odle said.

Towe, who went on to be the starting point guard on the 1974 NCAA national champion North Carolina State Wolfpack team and played briefly in both the NBA and the ABA, talked about how his tenure as a Golden Eagle shaped him into the man he is today.

"I always wanted to play for Oak Hill, that's all I ever wanted to do," Towe said.

"I was able to go on and do some other things, but it all started here with the foundation that I received academically, socially, and athletically. There's no better school. I've been in a lot of schools, but I've never been in a better high school than Oak Hill High School."

Jack Keefer, a four-time state champion and the

second-winningest coach in the state of Indiana with 778 victories, started his illustrious career at Oak Hill. A 1961 graduate of the school, Keefer went 61-26 from 1972-1976 before moving on to Lawrence North High School.

During his speech, he talked about how winning a state championship takes some blind luck at times, but more importantly, it takes coaches, players, and managers working in unison with one another.

"This group had to play as one," Keefer said. "Renbarger had to pull them together as one. Not five, not six, not seven, not 12, but one. When you get them together and they can play as one, you can get it done. And they did it."

Last, but certainly not least, Renbarger spoke at length about his state championship basketball team. After a disappointing end to the previous season, expectations for the Golden Eagles had never been higher.

The Golden Eagles went 12-4 in their first 16 games,

with their losses coming against New Castle, Floyd Central, Covington Catholic in Kentucky, and the defending 2A state champion Frankton Eagles.

The turning point for Oak Hill came on January 20. After Keefer and his Wildcats defeated the Golden Eagles, 61-37, all of the coaches and players took a hard look in the mirror, and realized they were not playing at the level they were capable of playing.

"I didn't like the makeup of our basketball team," Renbarger said in an interview back in May. "It had nothing to do with Xs and Os, I just didn't like the way that they were approaching games. I didn't like the way they were approaching practice. There was no joy. There was no camaraderie for each other or lifting each other up. We had a long conversation, and we pulled out film from two years ago, showing our bench mob with people supporting each other with a lot of enthusiasm. We wanted to get

back to doing that."

Oak Hill did not lose another game.

The Golden Eagles got back to loving the game of basketball, and, as the wins kept piling up, the expectations and the pressure slowly, but surely, melted away.

After defeating Tipton 59-42 on February 13, Renbarger and his staff knew that they had something special, and their new-found camaraderie with one another carried them through the rest of the season.

They cruised through their sectional, defeating Lewis Cass in the final by 41 points. They enacted revenge on Lapel before defeating Tipton for the second time. They went wire-to-wire with Westview in the semi-state in one of the most exhilarating games of the season.

Then, on March 24, at Bankers Life Fieldhouse, the Golden Eagles erased decades of frustration and heartbreak, delivering to the communities of Converse, Sweetser, and Swayzee a championship they so desperately coveted.

In his conclusion, Renbarger urged his team to never forget what they accomplished, and to carry it with them as they enter the next stages of their lives.

"You all are going to be connected forever," Renbarger said. "No matter what you do or where you go, don't run away from what you have done for yourselves, your families, and your community. I would encourage you to get together often and reminisce as much as possible. March 24, 2018, to me, is an anniversary to be celebrated often."

Season previews: Grant Co. soccer

While the boys soccer program is still relatively new at Eastbrook High School, they have quickly become one of the premier teams in Grant County, and 2017 was one of their best years yet.

Led by an aggressive offense, a daunting group of midfielders, and a top-flight goalkeeper, the Panthers finished with a 14-4-1 record, advancing to the regional final before losing to eventual state runner-up Fort Wayne Concordia.

While they lost players like Stephen Lakanen and John Velasquez to graduation, much of Eastbrook's talented roster is returning in 2018.

Throughout the offseason, along with the usual drills and conditioning, Head Coach Adam Hallis and the Panthers have worked quite a bit on team bonding, looking to find that flawless harmony that made them so successful a year ago.

"A big focus this offseason has been chemistry," Hallis said. "While we still have our top three midfielders coming back, and we have a lot of guys with experience, we still have to mesh. It's just getting a feel for another group of guys."

Along with that, while they were one of the top soccer teams a season ago, Hallis wanted his team to set their sights on what's ahead rather than behind. "The other focus is realizing that it is a new season with new challenges," Hallis continued. "We can enjoy what happened last year, but we need to be ready for this year."

The Panthers ran most of their offensive sets through the middle of the field in 2017, and with Noah Ross, Andrew Sieglein, and Zane Shilts all returning, that trend should continue. Ross led the Panthers with 12 goals last season, while Shilts and Siegelin combined for 10. "Those three, because

of their experience, will set the tone for us," Hallis said. "A lot of what we do runs through our midfield, and we like to control it with those three players."

Jacob Huber was a stud in the net in 2017, allowing just seven goals in 19 games. After playing club ball this summer, Hallis is impressed from what he has seen from his senior goalkeeper. "He looks good," Hallis said. "He's got confidence, his distribution has gotten better, and he has just built off of last season. He has the respect of his defense. I expect him to be just as solid as he was last year and have a great season for us."

The back line was equally as effective, keeping the ball out of the box and not putting Huber in dangerous situations. Conner Rakes and Lube Abston return to anchor the back end, while Ramzzy Bowser, Nathan Brainer, and Andrew Bruner will also look to make contributions.

On paper, the Panthers have one of the top rosters in the area, and Hallis believes that his team will be successful once again in 2018.

"I just want it to be beautiful soccer," Hallis concluded. "I think that with the talent that we have and the experience that we have, if we play the game the way it should be played, I think we have a chance to win a lot of games."

Caleb Oliver, Jared Hutchens, Jonas Reed, RJ Macomber, Seven Gray, Christian Riggs, Jalen Spurgeon, Christian Lemens, Tyler Anger, Connor Moritz, and Jose Esquivel were all major contributors on one of the most talented soccer teams in recent Marion history.

Unfortunately for the Giants, all of those young men were seniors, and none of them will be back for the 2018 season.

Macomber scored 18 goals for the Giants, while Reed and Anger combined for 14.

Gray, Riggs, Spurgeon, and Lemens were Marion's top defenders last year. Oliver was astounding all season long, giving up just nine goals in 18 games.

But head coach Jorge Berry, heading into his 13th year at the helm, is not worried in the slightest. In fact, he is incredibly confident in his young team heading into the 2018 season despite all of the turnover.

"Unfortunately, it's going to be hard to replace the seniors," Berry said. "but, I honestly think we could be a tad better than what we were last year. The reason I say this is because we will be more technically strong on the ball, and I think everybody is going to have a strong commitment to what we do. It should be really interesting."

The Giants have always had talent throughout Berry's tenure, but this year, his players have a high soccer IQ to go along with that talent. Because of this, he believes that his team will be more technically sound, which will lead to sustained success.

"I just think our touch will be a lot better overall," Berry continued. "We have always had the physical presence with the Macombers and the Boyds and the other people who could run over the years. Now, we have kids who are thinking about the game and not always relying on their athletic ability. Hopefully, we will see a lot of possession."

While the Giants lost a lot of their goal scoring with Macomber's departure, they have a plethora of young players ready to step up, including J.D. Fagan, Kyle Coryea, and Kevin Guy. Seth Sheren has put in a lot of work this offseason and is ready for a bigger workload, while Devante Boyd and Isak Lagerkvist look to be two of Marion's top scoring threats.

Prepping for a new era

In just over one month's time there will be football at Indiana Wesleyan University.

After two years of recruiting, building, and developing a program, the IWU Wildcats are set to play the first game in school history on September 1 against long-time rival Taylor University in one of the most highly anticipated events in recent memory.

Head Coach Jordan Langs has worked tirelessly since being hired in building the program from the ground up, but Eric Terrazas has also been a crucial piece of the puzzle in the team's formative years.

"We wanted young men who wanted to be challenged and who wanted to grow in their faith, all while receiving a phenomenal degree and playing for a football program that won't sacrifice excellence in what we do on the football field. We truly believe that we can bring in highly talented athletes that desire to be

in an academic and social environment that will challenge them to constantly live inside their best."

While the Wildcats did not play a single football game in 2016 and 2017, the team certainly prepared as if they did. Without the stress of having to gameplan for an opponent each week, the Wildcat focused on improving their fundamentals, increasing their strength, and grasping a deeper, more intimate knowledge of the game of football.

"I believe we did a great job laying the foundation for what we want this program to be," Terrazas said. "Our players trained and prepared with expectations that most first-year freshmen don't have to deal with. We grew and matured both on and off the field. I truly believe we grew up quickly because of the expectations we put on the group of young men we brought in this first year."

After watching his offense grow and develop over the past two seasons, Terrazas believes that he has the makings of something special at his disposal.

"We have a large group of players that have stood out over the past few years," Terrazas said. "We have a group of young men that we are extremely excited about. They have de-
