Harley-Davidson enthusiasts gather for ninth ‘Hog Daze’

Motorcycles fascinate. Always have; probably always will. Last weekend, Marion paid its tribute to cycles and bikers with the ninth annual edition of Hog Daze, a salute to Marion’s deep-seated ties to the lingo of motorcycling as “the home of the hog.”

Ninety-nine years ago, in the motorcycle racing season of 1920 on a five-mile course southwest of Marion a hot-shot racer riding for Harley-Davidson’s racing team, won the race. And when Ray Weishaar took his victory lap he rode it with a young pig—a “hog”—riding along in his lap.

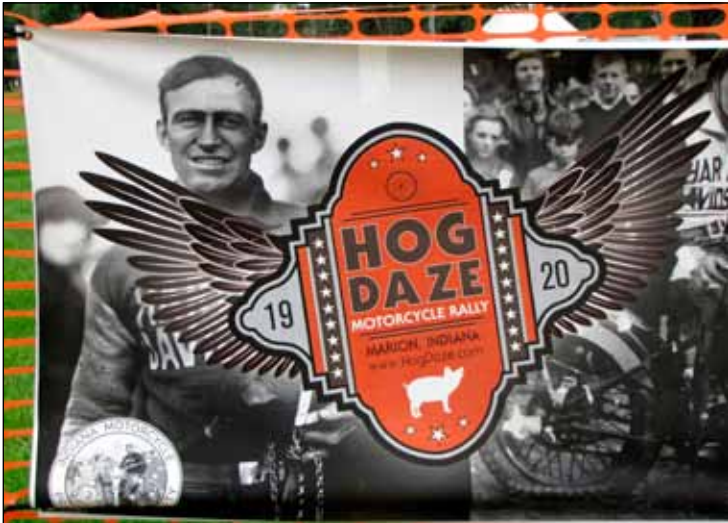

STEM camp ends with project demos

Recently the second annual STEM camp, which was held at McCulloch Junior High School, culminated with project demonstrations, a pizza party, and, most importantly, the recognition of talented students in the areas of science, technology, engineering, and math.

Throughout the four-week program, students focused their work in the areas of LEGO robotics, sphere bowling and automobiles, 3-D printing, and roller coasters. Kristen Isch, the camp’s director, explained that she and

her staff would give the students basic ideas, but then they would brainstorm amongst themselves to come up with creative endeavors. “We kind of gave them loose parameters, and they ran with it,” Isch said. “They could take it in

The STEM camp acts as a summer bridge program, as many of the participants will heading to

FSSI will host discussion on addiction

Ask anyone for a list of problems facing Grant County these days and drug addiction will surely be very high on the list, which makes the event to be hosted by the Family Service Society, Inc. (FSSI) on Tuesday, August 21 quite timely.

At 7 pm that night, after FSSI’s Circle of Friends luncheon, the organization will hold a “Conversation About Addictions,” featuring the keynote speaker Mary Cucarola, at the First Christian Church, 1970 N Wabash Rd., Marion.

Cucarola will answer questions for about an hour for families who have a loved one struggling with addiction or have lost a loved one to an overdose. Cucarola’s son battled addiction until his death from an overdose. Her message is one of hope and compassion emphasizing no one is to blame for a spirit damaged by addiction.

“The purpose of this event is to provide a forum for our families, support systems and caregivers to ask questions, gain resources and realize they are not alone in this journey,” said Iris Brunner, marketing and development director at FSSI. “Our main goal is to help families that feel isolated, create a group they can lean on and help them find hope in their current situation.”

A former CPA and business owner, Cucarola founded Cody’s Fresh Start Charity Works after her son passed away from an opioid overdose in 2013. She has devoted her time to helping others impacted by

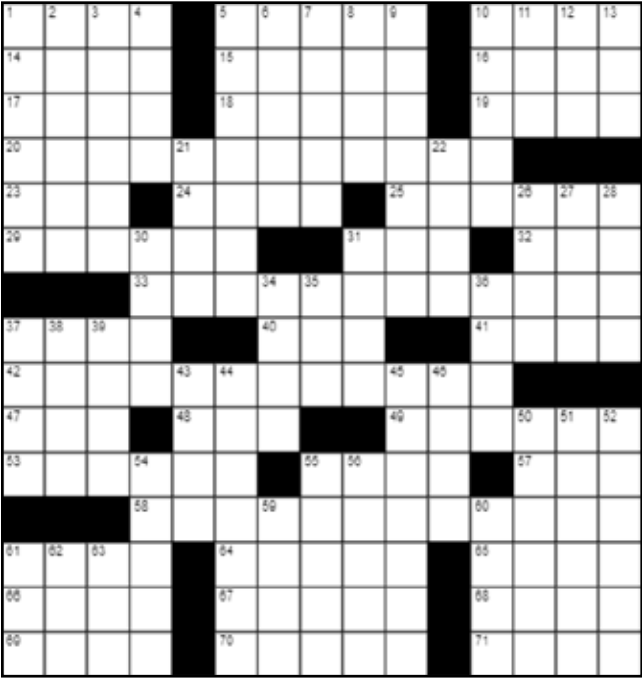

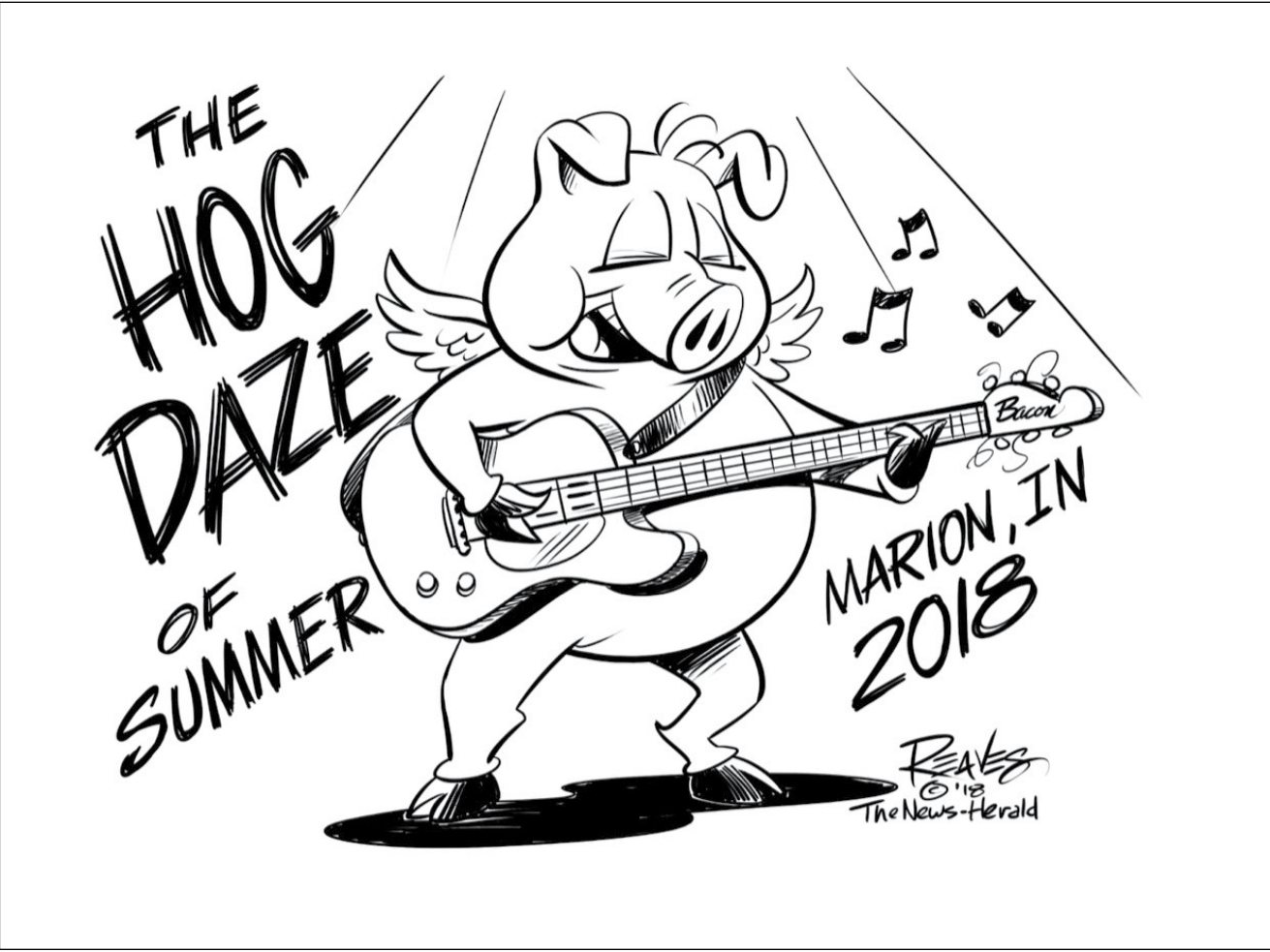

How much do you know—about yourself and others?

Mark 10:17-22
We take a lot for granted when we observe people in general. We often make the mistake of thinking that others know what we know. The only way of finding out what someone knows is by asking them.

How much do you know? What a powerful question. I cannot honestly tell you what I know. Life has been good to me and I do have a good memory, but I am just a common guy, not a genius!

In Mark's Gospel, we read a story of a rich young ruler who seemingly had it all and knew it all. He presented himself as a good guy with the total package. The story unfolds as he comes to Jesus

with a curious mind. At this point he is testing how much he knows as he converses with Jesus. He asks Jesus, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" As you think about this question what would you tell him? The amazing thing about our Lord is that He deals with all of us in a unique way. He created each and every one of us differently, and He works according to our makeup.

Jesus knows our hearts and this rich young ruler was no exception. Jesus quizzes him concerning the commandments because He knew the young man's weaknesses. This fellow had money, manners, and morals; however, he had his share of shortcomings. He didn't love God with all his heart. We must realize that salvation is a supernatural work, and this man was asking how to get to Heaven. Jesus asked him about the bottom six commandments, which are in stark contrast to the "Top Four." The top four deal with our relationship to God.

It was at this point that the man told Christ he observed the bottom six commandments. Jesus knew that answer before He asked. Now He directs the young man to the heart of the story, telling him: go and give away all your money, and then come and follow me. The man went away very sad. Why? Jesus didn't want his money, nor did He need his money, but Jesus wanted the young man's heart. Christ knew that money was the young

man's god.

Up until then, the rich man had not realized the world's power over him. He didn't understand that everlasting life is a gift. He couldn't grasp that the inheritance of everlasting life is not earned by our service. It is a gift, not a wage. When Jesus told him, "One thing thou lackest," I am sure he was shocked and disappointed.

There will never be a person who can live a life to the standard of earning Heaven. There is only one way to Jesus, and that is by realizing we are sinners. People do not have the means to absolve their own sin. The blood of Jesus was shed to wash us whiter than snow. When we confess Him as our Lord and Savior, He forgives us, cleanses us, and writes our name in the Lamb's Book of Life.

There is nothing we can do to earn what Jesus does for us. It is a gift.

What Christ did for me in 1975 will never be forgotten. My life was transformed, never to be the same. Has there been a time you have asked Christ to forgive you of your sins and save you? If you would like to talk, please call me. This is the most important decision in this life you will ever make. If you miss Jesus, you have missed it all.

A Hoosier Republican calls out the president

Before we move ahead here today we have to agree on a couple of things. First is that Bill Ruckelshaus, a figure on the Republican political scene in Indiana for the better part of half a century, is about as decent and honorable a man as can be found. Second is that he is as mainstream GOP as it is possible to be. Finally, we have to agree that, on the night of Nixon's "Saturday night massacre" back in 1973—the night Ruckelshaus was fired by the President for his refusal to fire Archibald Cox—he showed personal courage under withering fire.

"Ruck," as he is known to political cronies from Angola to Evansville, is 86 years old now. He practiced law, created the shape and form of the Environmental Protection Agency in its infancy, ran the FBI for a short time and was a deputy attorney general of the United States up until that Saturday night.

All this to set the stage for the conduct of William D. Ruckelshaus last week when, in his sunset years, he summoned the courage yet again to do the right thing, to do what needed to be done, to step up when no one else would.

He did so on the editorial page of the Washington Post newspaper. He wrote

an article under the headline "Only One Other President Has Acted This Desperate."

And he is speaking, writing about, two presidents, one of whom he knew very well, Richard Nixon, and the other the current occupant of the White House, Donald Trump.

There's no point in dwelling on Ruckelshaus's integrity or courage. Both are demonstrable. When he and Birch Bayh squared off in the U.S. Senate race in 1968, it was one of those rare moments when the voters could not lose; either man could serve with pride. That time, Bayh won and Ruck lost.

Now, stepping from the shadows again, he opens his opinion piece thusly:

"President Trump is acting with a desperation I've seen only once before in Washington: 45 years ago when President Richard M. Nixon ordered the firing of special Watergate prosecutor Archibald Cox. Nixon was fixated on ending the Watergate investigation, just as Trump wants to shut down the Mueller investigation into Russian interference in the 2016 election.

"A lesson for the president from history: It turned out badly for Nixon. Not only could he not derail the investigation, but also, 10 months later, he was forced to resign the presidency."

Not a terribly subtle message from Ruckelshaus, but, as he sees it right now, we have little time for subtlety. He goes on:

"Not only was that Saturday night the beginning of the end of the Nixon presidency, but it also accelerated the growing wave of political cynicism and distrust in our government we are

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we should not complicate his job. Support him, and when he has finished his work, listen to what he has found.

"I hope the president at last studies the lessons of a history I lived—and that he heeds its warning."

County teams come together for soccer jamborees

Boys

With the season just around the corner, all four Grant County teams showed flashes of potential, and revealed areas in need of improvement during the annual Grant County Boys Soccer Jamboree at Mississinewa High School on Saturday.

The Eastbrook Panthers finished 2-0 on the day with a 2-0 win over the Marion Giants and a 5-0 win over the Mississinewa Indians. Along with losing to Eastbrook, the Giants came away with a 1-1 draw against the Oak Hill Golden Eagles. Oak Hill defeated Mississinewa 4-1 in the first scrimmage the day.

New faces

Of all the teams in the county, Marion suffered the most roster turnover from last year. The Giants lost 18-goal scorer RJ Macomber, top goaltender Caleb Oliver, and stalwart defenders Seven Gray and Christian Riggs, just to name a few. On Saturday, it was clear that the Giants were still searching for that chemistry that made them so successful a season ago.

“We’ve got a lot of work to do, and we’ve got a lot of soul searching to do, too,” Marion Head Coach Jorge Berry said. “We had a lot of bickering amongst ourselves, but we’ll learn, and we’ll be okay.”

Berry hopes that his young squad will figure out how to play for each other rather than themselves. “Technically, we are stronger than we were on the ball, but you’ve got to play with some heart too,” Berry said. “Once we gave up the first goal [against Eastbrook], our heads went down, and on the second goal, I heard the fat lady singing. Hopefully, they take this experience and run with it. If they want to participate and play together, we will do really well.”

Athletic ability

New Oak Hill Head Coach Joel Garverick, a 2013 graduate of the school, inherits a team rich with athletic ability all over the pitch, especially on the front lines and in the

midfield. “We have a lot of talented kids, and we continue to preach that they have a lot of potential,” Garverick said. Even though the Golden Eagles showcased themselves well throughout the day, in particular the efforts by Gavin Holz and Luke VanBibber, Garverick knows that there are still areas to fix.

“I think we had our moments, but like any preseason game or any Jamboree, there are definitely going to be things to work on,” Garverick said. “I think we had some nice moments we could build on, and we also had a lot of things in our game that we can improve on as well.”

“It was nice to get a little bit of time under our belts so we could figure some things out. We recognized some kinks in our system, things that we need to fix, and things that we need to change. It’s great to have something like this where we can do that.”

Midseason form

The Panthers, much like the Golden Eagles, return a plethora of talented players, including midfielders Noah Ross and Zane Shilts, defender Andrew Sieglin, and goalkeeper Jacob Huber. Throughout the late morning and early afternoon, Eastbrook ran its offense to perfection on multiple occasions, particularly in their scrimmage against Mississinewa, while their defense kept opposing offenses from gaining much traction.

“Those three midfielders are great,” Eastbrook Head Coach Adam Hallis said. “Noah and Zane lock in the defense. Andrew will screen our defense, win the ball, and get it up to them. We have a lot of guys that move off the ball, and we have a lot of different guys who can score for us.”

While not tested much on Saturday, Huber stopped every shot he faced, looking like the same goalkeeper who was such a key component for the Panthers a season ago. “He’s huge for us back there,” Hallis said of Huber. “He has really grown into that position over the last three years, and he really directs it back there. We rely on him a lot.”

While the Panthers seemed to be in midseason form already, Hallis knows that there is still work to accomplish. “There were still some things that we need to iron out,” Hallis said. “We need to get in shape still I think, and there are definitely some things we still need to work on. The defense is still a work in progress for us, and we are still learning [about] each other on offense.”

“It’s nice to get out and play. You take today, you look at what you did well, and you look at what you didn’t do well and try to get [everything] ready for next week.”

A work in progress

While Eastbrook looks ready to go for the season, the Indians are still in work in progress.

Jared Reel, who coached at Oak Hill the past two seasons, is determined to bring that success to Mississinewa, whose program has labored in recent seasons.

“We’ve got a lot of young kids,” Reel said. “Our program has struggled because they haven’t been taught other than kick the ball and run with it. I’m trying to get them to learn how to play the game—positions, movements—and it’s all new to them.”

“My style of play is all new to them. They probably haven’t ever played this style of play, unless they played at a club somewhere, and most of my kids aren’t club players. So, we are trying to institute that. It’s a learning experience. It’s going to be a struggle for a little while, but once they figure it out, I think we will see more wins than we did last year.”

In both of their scrimmages, several defensive breakdowns led to quality scoring chances, which Oak Hill and Eastbrook both capitalized on.

While there is still a learning curve ahead, Reel believes that his team will figure it out as the season progresses. “We are going to turn this around,” Reel said. “We are going to be putting up wins instead of losses. The goal is to [accrue] some more wins, build up a program, and teach them how to play.”

Girls

In their final tune-up before the regular season begins, all four Grant County girls soccer showcased their immense potential, while concurrently working to fix areas of their game in need of improvement or correction.

Late coaching change

Despite a crazy few weeks for Marion, which included a late coaching change, the Giants played some excellent soccer, and Taylor Kitts looked to already be in mid-season form. Kitts, Marion’s leading goal scorer last season, found the back of the net seven times on Saturday afternoon, scoring four goals against Mississinewa in a 6-0 shutout and three against Oak Hill in a 4-1 victory.

However, even though Marion played well overall, new Head Coach Jacob Boggs is not resting on his laurels just yet. “I thought we were good, but not great,” Boggs said. “We have a lot of room for improvement. I love what I’m seeing, but it’s a process. I want to make sure the ladies know that if we keep working hard, we are only going to get better.”

Jazmyn Turner, one of Marion’s top basketball players, is now the Giants’ starting goalkeeper. She only allowed one goal all afternoon, but Boggs knows that it will be a work in progress. “Again, it’s a process,” Boggs said of Turner. “It’s totally different when you go from basketball, where you don’t use your feet, to soccer, where you use your feet and your hands. We just have to get her used to that.”

Youth and inexperience

Much like the Golden Eagles, the Indians have a plethora of youth and inexperience, and it showed in their first scrimmage against Marion. “We struggled in the first game with our effort,” Wilson said. “We were really nervous. I’ve got 24 girls and 14 of them have never played before. It was their first time out here, and they were scared.”

Even though they were also shut out in their second game against Eastbrook, Wilson was much happier with how her team executed. “I felt like our effort was better, our movement

Along with that, Oak Hill’s returners, including top scorer Carlee Biddle and steadfast defenders Lizzie Wood and Elizabeth McDivitt, have taken the time to help out many of the Golden Eagles’ younger players, many of whom have played little or no soccer before this season.

As the summers winds down and the season gets underway, mastering the basics will be key to Oak Hill’s success in 2018. “Every day, we are going to put a lot [of emphasis] on the fundamentals because soccer is such a chemistry sport,” Durrwachter said.

Ignoring the score

Along with their three-goal loss to Marion, the Golden Eagles dropped a 1-0 decision to Eastbrook earlier in the day, but, despite the outcomes, Head Coach Katelyn Durrwachter was proud of her team’s performance.

“I was actually very pleased with today, ignoring the scoreboard,” Durrwachter said. “Honestly, we are small in numbers and small in experience this year, but it’s been really neat to see

The biggest issue plaguing the Indians has been the injury bug: striker Alayna Webb is out indefinitely with a concussion and defender Sam Tann has had a nagging hamstring injury, which forced her to leave the contest against Eastbrook.

Once the Indians get healthy, and their core of Beth Lucas, Taylor Ulerick, Webb, and Laekyn Emmons get rolling, Mississinewa should be much improved in the 2018 season.

Working out jitters

On their home pitch, Eastbrook showed why they were one of the top teams in the county a year ago. In their first match against Oak Hill, Sarah Foulk, who led the Panthers with 22 goals last season, netted one early, and while the offense fell into a rut, subsequently, the defense took care of the rest, shutting down the Golden Eagles’ attack the rest of the way.

“On our first game, I think we were working out some jitters of being on the field for the first time together with everybody,” Eastbrook Head Coach Jamie Hallis said. “Our offense struggled against the Oak Hill defense—they did a good job defending us.”

Against Mississinewa in the final scrimmage of the day, the Eastbrook offense was unleashed. Foulk scored again, while freshman Britney Trujillo made the most of her opportunities, scoring twice. “They did a lot better in the second game,” Hallis said. “They spread the field out and seemed to connect on their passes better.”

Throughout the off-season, Hallis has been pleased with how her team has performed, and expects that strong play to carry over into the 2018 campaign. “The girls have been doing really well and doing what I have been asking them to do.”

Marion and Eastbrook will square off on the gridiron

Last Tuesday afternoon, Eastbrook Athletic Director Brad Yordy and Marion Athletic Director Steve Moritz announced that the Giants and the Panthers will be entering a four-year contract to play each other in football beginning in the 2019 season.

Marion and Eastbrook will face off in the first week of the regular season for the duration of the contract. The first game of the series will be held at Marion High School on August 23 next year.

Since being named Eastbrook’s head coach 30 years ago, Jeff Adamson has established one of the premier football programs not just in Grant County, but in the state of Indiana for Class 2A. The Panthers were state runners up in 2016 before advancing to the semi-state last season.

Craig Chambers, on the other hand, is entering just his third season at the helm for the Giants, but in his short tenure, he has turned the program around. After the Giants won just one game in the 2014 and 2015 seasons combined, Chambers has led the Giants to 12 wins, which included a 7-4 record in 2017.

Moritz pitched the idea of adding Eastbrook to the schedule during his first stint as Marion’s athletic director, but it did not materialize. However, the two schools agreed to scrimmage against one another during the summer—a tradition that has continued over the past two decades.

With Marion entering the final year of its contract with Huntington North and Eastbrook doing the same with Norwell, the stars perfectly aligned. Now, they will get to play each other for real.

“For us, when Mr. Moritz and I start talking about this, we thought it would be a neat, local rivalry,” Yordy said. “This made perfect sense for us. We had some contracts that were up or got adjusted that allowed us the opportunity to do this, so we are excited.”

“We are extremely excited about this,” Moritz added. “What we are hoping to do



with football and other sports is to build relationships, and we think a series like this is very advantageous.”

With Marion’s recent resurgence, Adamson believes that this four-year series will be electrifying for both schools and for the area as a whole.

“It’s a real exciting game for us,” Adamson said. “It’s an opportunity for us to play against a really good opponent. Coach Chambers has done a great job reestablishing Marion as a powerhouse there in 4A, so it’s a great game for us. That’s number one.

“Number two, I think it’s an exciting game for the county. There’s a lot of football stuff going on in Grant County with IWU starting their program this year, so I think it’s a game that’s going to generate a lot of excitement to start the season.”

While it will certainly be a football game that fans will enjoy, it will also serve as an early season test for Adamson’s Panthers over the next four years. “Scheme-wise, Marion does a lot of things that will help prepare us for the tournament,” Adamson said. “We are seeing a lot of stuff offensively that we don’t see within our conference. Those two things are going to make it a good game for us.”

As Marion football continues its rise back to prominence, Chambers is excited to go against one of the best coaches in the history of Grant County on a much bigger scale. “It’s amazing,” Chambers said of playing Eastbrook. “I have a lot of respect for Coach Adamson. His experience and knowledge of the game is impeccable. We are excited to kick it off against them next year.”

Chambers also believes that going against a worthy opponent like Eastbrook will



help his team in the long run. “I like to have a tough schedule,” Chambers said. “To me, when you have a tough schedule, it prepares you for the postseason. I want to test our kids and see what they can do early on in the season.”

While the coaches were fired up and ready to go, administrators from both schools were equally as eager to get started. “We’ve got five Grant County schools, and it seems like each one of them is a rivalry,” Eastbrook Principal Patrick McLaughlin said. “It didn’t make sense that we were leaving one of them out. To be able to add Marion to the schedule will be exciting for everybody.”

Eastbrook Superintendent Brett Garrett and Marion Principal Keith Burke summed it all up nicely, stating that these games will bring both the Marion and Eastbrook communities together. “We are very thankful for this opportunity,” Garrett said. “We feel like our football program is second to none, and we love to compete. We feel like Marion is a quality opponent, and we want to facilitate that relationship with Marion. We have a mutual respect for each other, and we want to see that play out on the football field. It’s great for our student athletes and great for our community.”

“I think it’s great for our fans and our students,” Burke concluded. “It will be a great rivalry. Jeff is doing a great job and Craig’s brought our program up, so I think it’s going to be exciting football.”

Hahn takes over at Club

The Boys and Girls Club of Grant County is under new leadership.

With the retirement of Julie (Cline) Harmon, Jeff Hahn, who began his time at the Club as an AmeriCorps volunteer, was recently promoted to executive director and is ready to serve the youth of Marion and Grant County as a whole.

Hahn’s path to executive director certainly took some soul searching. A 1999 Marion High School graduate, Hahn planned to pursue higher level education, but circumstances changed after the birth of his first daughter, and so, he took employment wherever he could find it.

From 1999 until 2013, Hahn worked hard to find his calling, but it was not until he met Amy Alcock and Vicki Conrad, both of whom worked at Indiana Wesleyan University, that his purpose would be realized.

Alcock and Conrad took notice of Hahn while he was working as a softball coach, and both women realized how gifted he was with children. In fact, they encouraged him to apply at Frances Slocum Elementary School in Marion, which had several job openings.

At Justice, Hahn specialized with children who have learning and behavioral issues, mentoring them and providing academic assistance. He performed the same duties at the Boys and Girls Club, while also organizing the athletics.

Now, as executive director, Hahn will be starting several new programs, which includes those geared towards community service, managing finances, and job shadowing.

Children are the future, and Hahn wants to see them contribute to their communities, and the world, in a

positive manner.

“I see the city like the body,” Hahn said. “Everything on the outside might be good, but if the inside is not right, and we aren’t taking care of the inside, the body is destroyed. That’s the same way with the city. We can beautify it by the buildings, the trees, and different things, but if we are not uplifting or changing the lives of the people, the city is dead. It starts with the youth. We have to get into the minds of the youth and change the chaotic behavior that we’re seeing now.”

The name says Boys and Girls Club of Grant County, and that’s we want to stand on. We want to give [the children] a safe environment to come to, teach them how to reach their full potential, and how to be great, caring, and productive citizens. We want to do that in all ways possible.”

County teams scrimmage to prepare for season

Eastbrook at Marion

With just a week to go before the regular season begins, the Marion Giants and the Eastbrook Panthers held their annual scrimmage at Dick Lootens Stadium on Friday evening, giving their fans an early glimpse of what to expect in the coming campaign.

The scrimmage was broken up into several different sections, as Marion and Eastbrook each played on offense and defense an equal number of times. Several players stood out, both defenses were outstanding, and the offenses, while flashy at times, were inconsistent.

Dominant defense

The Giants' defense was particularly dominant, holding a lethal Panthers' rushing attack largely at bay throughout the course of the evening. Brendon Martin and Dre Aguilar, arguably the best defensive end tandem in Grant County and in the North Central Conference, set the edge nicely on running plays. Reubin Brewer, a senior defensive tackle, dominated the trenches, making at least three big tackles at the line of scrimmage. Xavier Gee was all over the field at the linebacker position, while Brayden Burke had an interception in the end zone during a red zone drill.

Just like last year, the Gi-

ants defensive unit is going to be a talented group in 2018. "We knew the defense was going to be our strong point," Marion Head Coach Craig Chambers said. "We are bringing back nine starters, so they are definitely going to carry us."

Many eyes were on Marion's junior quarterback, Keshawn Taylor, and he did not disappoint. He flashed some big-play ability, was elusive in the pocket, and showcased excellent touch on his passes. Furthermore, he threw a couple of nice touchdown passes—one to Burke in the back of the end zone and a strike to Martin down the right sideline later in the session.

While incredibly talented, Taylor is still a work in progress, and will only get better as the season progresses. "He's a good guy," Chambers said of Taylor. "We just have to do small things with him, help him make the correct reads, different things like that. Once he gets it, though, he is going to be very impressive out there."

Overall, after what he saw on Friday night, Chambers is confident that his offensive unit will be running on all cylinders in the not so distant future. "We are going to be okay," Chambers said. "We just have to start out slow at the beginning, but we are going to pick it up during the season. Our offense is going to get a lot better, and we are going to score some points."

ally well," Eastbrook Head Coach Jeff Adamson said. "We played fast, and, for the most part, we did a decent job of containing a lot of their speed, so I think that was good for us."

Eastbrook's offense, like Marion's, had some trouble getting on track. The Panthers have five new starting offensive linemen, and at times they did not seem to get much of a push up front, which stalled the running game. Along with that, they struggled with regularity.

"The offense felt slow and sluggish, like we were just a step behind," Adamson said. "We'd get a nice play, and then we'd have two in a row that weren't right, so we have to be more consistent."

The Panthers have a running back by committee approach, using several different ball carriers throughout the course of a game, but Xaine Kirby looks to be in line for a big season. He ran hard all evening long against a near impregnable Giants' front seven, and showed his speed on a long scamper down the right sideline during the Panthers' first offensive possession.

"He has had a fantastic offseason," Adamson said of Kirby. "We kind of used him at two different spots. We had him at fullback and at one of the slot positions. Tonight was the first time he had ever carried it from the slot position, and he played well. He is going to get a workout on Friday nights."

As it was announced last Tuesday, the Giants and the Panthers have entered a four-year football contract starting in the 2019 season. The Panthers will play the Giants in Week 1 at Dick Lootens Stadium next August, and Adamson is already raring to go.

"It's really neat," Adamson said. "It will be an exciting game for us because it's an absolute win-win. We get to see some very fast players and a diverse offense so that will help us in our conference play and in the tournament. [Also,] I just like playing here. I remember coming over here when Coach [Mark] Surface was here and Coach Lootens. A lot of good football has been

played here."

Marion will open their season on Friday, August 17 against Huntington North at 7 pm, while Eastbrook begins their campaign at 7:30 pm against the Norwell Knights. Both games are at each team's respective home stadiums.

Mississinewa volleyball

The beauty of scrimmages is that, in the end, they do not count towards the win or the loss column. Because of this, coaches use scrimmages to see which areas their teams are excelling in, where they can improve, and, most importantly, how far they have come.

That is exactly what new Mississinewa volleyball coach Jody Bolser did on Thursday night in the Indians' exhibition match with the Jay County Patriots. After running through multiple scenarios and offensive sets, the two teams split a two-game contest. Mississinewa won a thrilling 29-27 decision in the first set before Jay County ran away with a 25-15 victory in the second set.

The Indians showed their incredible potential in spurts throughout the evening, but Bolser admitted that they could have performed much better. "We played nervous, and we started nervous," Bolser said. "It was very obvious. They worked through that, but we didn't play at the intensity level where I have seen them play. We were just really easy to read, we weren't taking advantage of any mismatches, and we didn't play with finesse."

While the Indians have a plethora of new faces on the team this season, most of their returning roster has been through the grind of a volleyball season. At times on Thursday, the Indians, particularly those returning players, made some uncharacteristic mistakes. "I think that we are too old to play scared," Bolser said. "I get it, it's the first scrimmage, but we need to use our experience to our advantage, and we did not necessarily do that."

Along with that, the Indians seemed to telegraph their

every move, which gave Jay County the advantage. "Our hitters need to trust that they can take the next step," Bolser said. "We weren't taking advantage of the whole net. I felt like we kind of stayed home a little bit too much. Height or no height, athletic or no athletic ability, if we are that easy to read, it's going to be easy for our opponents to pick up what we are trying to put down."

However, there were plenty of positives from Thursday's performance against the Patriots.

Junior Tyra Stanley, who will be the Indians' primary setter this coming season, finished strong after a little bit of a sluggish start, and Bolser is certain that she will only continue to improve. "We saw Tyra, by the second half of the scrimmage, taking on a leadership role," Bolser said. "She started to communicate a little bit more, and when she gains the confidence in herself that we already have in her, she can take the team to a different level."

Furthermore, once the Indians began to run their offense with more efficiency, the difference in their play was noticeable. "It's easy to run them in hitting lines, but they haven't really put it into play in a scrimmage-type setting or any kind of situation besides from practice," Bolser said. "We looked better when we started to run some stuff, and we played with a little more confidence."

There is no question that the Indians are going to be a team to be reckoned with this coming season. They have an athletic, and long, front line, which includes Kirsten Lockwood, Halle Planck, and Bolser's daughters, Cailyn and Caily, both of whom are over six feet tall. Emily Taylor and Riley McKee are gifted defensive specialists, while Madison Stanley and Jenna Berryhill give the Indians two more excellent offensive players.

Now, they just need to put it all together. "They just need to take what they execute in practice and execute it in a game situation," Bolser concluded. "It's right there."
