Justice delayed: a three-part series

More than half of inmates have not been convicted

Part one of three
Three out of five people in local jails across the United States have not been convicted of the crime for which they are incarcerated. The Grant County jail has a high number of inmates that are awaiting trial or sentencing. This series of stories looks at the Grant County jail system in an attempt to shed light on the circumstances affecting pretrial detention.

More than half of the inmates currently held in the Grant County jail have not been convicted of the charges for which they are being held.

"I don't have a specific number of how many inmates are awaiting sentencing; however, there are some inmates who have more than one

case, which contributes to their trial wait," said Lt. Kevin Carmichael, Grant County Jail commander.

On Oct. 9, 2019, the jail had 285 inmates, 32 of which have been convicted of their offenses. Roughly 253 inmates have not been convicted of their offenses; this is 88.8 per-

cent of the jail's inmates.

One inmate waited since Aug. 7, 2017, to receive a sentence. Kyle Lamar Johnson was charged with attempted murder, aggravated battery, violation of probation, and the unlawful possession of a firearm. This is the most extended amount of time that an inmate had awaited sentencing, according to Carmichael.

Sheriff Reggie Nevels of the Grant County said, "Our jail population is increased, and so is the number of those inmates that are here sitting waiting on trial. That is what upset me to a degree. We have inmates that have been here for three years awaiting trial."

According to the Vera Institute of Justice, in 2015, 64 percent of in-

Restoration of Wolfe Building is complete

An historic downtown building—once condemned—is alive and well thanks to the efforts of a small group of ambitious local investors working with the City of Marion. What many referred to as an eyesore is now occupied for commercial and residential use, and boasts a bright, appealing façade.

For several years, the 1920 building at 139 E. 3rd St. sat abandoned after its previous owner, Stephen P. Wolfe, vacated. It had been deemed unsafe, and the City of Marion took ownership in 2015. Bryant's death gives pause to consider life's fragility

The death of Kobe Bryant last week seemed to send people in a tailspin. It also seemed to give people reason to pause, value life and take a purposeful moment to tell someone they love just that.

On January 26, a Sikorsky S-76B helicopter crashed in Calabasas, California, around 30 miles northwest of Los Angeles, en route from John Wayne Airport to Camarillo, California. It was carrying former basketball player Kobe Bryant, his daughter Gianna, six family friends, including baseball coach John Altobelli and his wife and daughter, and the pilot. All on board were killed.

life is when I went to the visitation of a man whose parents, grandparents, uncles, aunts and cousins had all attended my church at one time.

As we walked in and were greeted by one of his uncles who had lost his teenage son a year prior, I once again recalled the importance of never taking it for granted. We shared how, as a parent, you want to protect your children, yet you also know you can't bubble wrap them; you must let them go and trust God will protect them. The man, who died when he was struck by a bus as he walked along the highway, had just left his parents house not 30 minutes prior. He had had car

trouble and was walking possibly to his house for help. Understandably, his parents were grief-filled, not being able to comprehend why it had happened.

I also wondered why God had decided that day, at that moment, that this man's life should end. As a Christian, I hold on to the belief that this man is in Heaven where there is no suffering or pain. I know and believe that God has a plan for each of us and we must always live our lives believing that God is the answer.

It is hard to understand why God has tragedies in our master plan, why God allows some people to suffer with cancer and other diseases, or why someone has a mental illness that causes them to struggle with day-to-day activities.

In looking at my own life, I feel as if God so far has spared me from major illnesses or heartache. While the death of my dad was difficult, I believe God had been preparing me for the last couple years for that to happen.

My sister and brother and I have always thought that, between my mom and dad, my dad would be the first to go. He had lost both his brothers already, while both his sisters who are much older are still living on their own. My dad had been struggling with an un-

known medical issue, which Dr. Goodstein at Marion General Hospital diagnosed as stage four lung and brain cancer during a visit to Indianapolis last June.

While I don't live my life day-to-day wondering when I will be called to Heaven, there is a bit of me that can't help but wonder. And, as I occasionally let

my mind wonder to my end, it makes me a little more focused on my day's purpose, trying to live each day to my greatest potential, hoping the world sees the good and not the bad in me.

Bill would take some stress off of our military families

Taping up boxes of personal belongings and loading them on a truck is just one of many tasks that come with moving into a new home. If that new home is in another state, that adds another level of stress to any family. For families in the military, those moves happen frequently when a parent gets orders to a new base, and they may not coincide with a child's academic calendar. I authored House Bill 1091 to ensure students' education opportunity is not interrupted when their family is relocated to a new area.

Under this legislation, families would be able to enroll their children in school before they establish residency in the district if they provide the proper documentation. Roughly 185,000 military children move between schools annually, and about a third of them move during their school year. During this transition, some students experience a gap in their educational experience, which could result in incomplete grades.

This bill does not only address students moving through our K-12 education system, it also allows for dependents' and spouses of military personnel based in our state to receive in-state tuition at Indiana universities. In most cases, students will have to live in the state for at least two years in order to receive the lower rate to pay for their education. This legislation would ensure that dependents and spouses from active military families could receive in-state tuition during active duty and allow them to keep paying that rate if their family is given orders to relocate to another state.

mates detained in jails across the nation were charged with crimes but not convicted of the offenses.

Angela Haley, chief of the Marion Police Department, said that the current criminal justice system needs reform. "We want to make sure that we weed out who needs to be in jail and who doesn't," Haley said. "No system is perfect. We have to find new and better ways to do things. Not everybody needs to be locked up."

For Chief Haley, this is not just a law enforcement problem, it is society's problem.

"It's everyone's problem. It's our problem," Haley said. "If we have that jail packed with low-level offenders, then we might not have room for the violent offenders that really need to be there. It's also frustrating because bad behavior must have consequences."

A burden on taxpayers

The amount of time that inmates spend in jail causes a massive burden on taxpayers as well as local jail systems. Law enforcement is the largest government expense in Grant County.

"We are overcrowded by inmates staying here. That is one of the biggest problems we deal with," Nevells said. "Here at the jail, you know, we don't have a room and seems like we are running out of it."

"We want to make sure that we weed out who needs to be in jail and who doesn't," Haley said. "No system is perfect. We have to find new and better ways to do things. Not everybody needs to be locked up."

The Grant County jail receives \$37.50 per inmate a day to pay for food, clothing, and medical expenses. The jail has consistently housed over 200 inmates each year. On average, the jail spends \$3,900,937 on its inmates each year—a monetary amount that just covers the daily cost of living expenses such as food and clothing.

"It's not enough," Carmichael said. "Nobody in law enforcement will tell you that it is."

Defense attorney David Glickfield said that pretrial detention contributes to the problem of overcrowded jails. "The jail has the responsibility of housing people locally. Historically, our jail has been full and past capacity. Our judges have tried very hard, and the Sheriff, to make sure that we do not go past capacity (at the jail)," Glickfield said. "Yet they have to ensure public safety by making sure that dangerous people stay in jail."

The Sheriff's Department also has to maintain the condition of the jail facility. Captain Ed Beatty, Grant County Sheriff's Department, said that the jail is currently falling apart. "You take our jail,

one year service at the jail is actually equivalent to seven to 12 years," Beatty said. "With the number of people we have rolling in and out, and everything that we are doing within the facility, the [Grant County] Council just budgeted \$5.5 million in infrastructure repairs. Just the infrastructure."

In addition to the burden on the taxpayers, overcrowding also wears on jail personnel. Beatty said that the jail needs more than just infrastructure repairs; it needs more personnel who are willing to work the high-demanding job. "We don't stop," Beatty said. "We are here 24/7, 365 days a year. So it does become a burden on us."

Found that old newspaper on Sunday, Super Bowl day, and before I pitched it I glanced at the sports page, which was graced by a nice picture of a gentle-looking old man with thinning white

hair, glasses and a striped sport coat, all beneath the headline that read: "A lot of us would be in jail."

So I gave it a second look at and quick read. The old man was—is—Kevin Butler, the one-time field goal kicker for the Chicago Bears, the little guy who trotted out onto Soldier Field all those times back in 1985-86 to finish off drives by Walter Payton and Jim McMahon and all those glorious victories that year, especially the 44-0 drubbing of the dreaded Dallas Cowboys and the Super Bowl XX win, where the

end sweeps. Walter Payton was taken from us 21 years ago now. Can't be, but it is.

That is why Kevin Butler looks like an old man: because he is.

Butler's picture was there because he was the luncheon speaker for the Gary Old Timers Athletic Association Banquet. Old guys love to listen to other old guys tell old stories, don't we?

Butler, who wore number six, was a Bear for 11 of his 13 seasons in the National Football League. Dependable to a fault. A lot like Adam Vinatieri. Didn't miss. Automatic. Until it wasn't.

Talking to the old timers, Butler, who is pushing 60, but not there just yet, let himself drift back to the season of '85. "A lot of us would be in jail, including me, if we did today what we did then," he said. "Those personalities just freaked the NFL out. The NFL got a tighter grip on its marketing because of us."

"They had never seen a team collectively with 30 guys who were characters come together and do business together the way we did on Sundays," Butler said.

Indeed. Remember the antics of Jim McMahon? He wore a white headband with "Pluto" written on it in the Super Bowl. He had aggravated everyone except the fans during the season with his Adidas sweatband.

Eastbrook loses to South Adams

For three quarters on Wednesday evening, the Eastbrook Panthers played solid basketball, receiving strong contributions from Johwen McKim and Kristen Goff, but their offense struggled in the final quarter. They scored just three points in the last eight minutes as the Starfires battled back to win the game, 47-39.

Behind 13 first-half points from McKim, Eastbrook built a 13-7 lead after the first quarter and a 25-20 advantage at half-

Panthers over Blackford

After a regular season marked by ups and downs, the Eastbrook Panthers head into sectional play on a high note, defeating an improved Blackford squad, 42-36.

Eastbrook's defense kept the game close in the first two quarters, as the Bruins took a three-point lead at halftime on a buzzer-beating trey, but in the second half, the Panthers came out refocused and refreshed, their offense began to find its rhythm, and their stout defensive helped them pull away from Blackford in the final two quarters.



"It all boiled down to the things we've been talking about all year that we've been struggling with," Eastbrook Head Coach Jeff Liddick said. "We went into halftime down three, [but] we were doing all the right things on the defensive end. I just challenged the girls and said, 'Put together a second half like you did the other night against South Adams, and I promise you you'll win this game.'"

"We came out in the second half and outscored them 31-22, and it just came down to taking care of the basketball, getting stops on the defensive end, and then being patient on the offensive end and putting the ball in the basket," Liddick said. "We shot close to 43 percent in the second half...and we were nine-of-11 from the free throw line. The girls did a great job...of finishing it and getting a solid conference win."

Johwen McKim led the Panthers with nine points and four assists, while Kristen Goff and Sedah McKim each finished with eight.

Argylls top Alexandria

Four players finished in double figures, which included a career-high 14-point performance from Daya Greene, as the Argylls head in sectional



play after a 51-43 triumph over the Alexandria Tigers.

Along with scoring 14 points, Greene, one of the smaller players on the court, played like she was one of the biggest, collecting nine rebounds. Zoey Barnett recorded a double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds, five on the offensive glass,

while Azmae Turner also scored 12 points. Gracey Fox capped off Madison-Grant's double-digit scoring with 10 points, eight of which came after halftime. "We set the tone early defensively," Madison-Grant Head Coach Brandon Bradley said. "And then, we figured out how to score in the third quarter."

In the guts of the game, Madison-Grant knocked down the shots they needed to.

Clinging to a two-point advantage, Greene acted as the closer, knocking down two crucial free throws to make it a four-point game at 44-40. Fox followed with a field goal, and Greene hit two more free throws to give the Argylls

a 48-40 advantage they would not relinquish. At the free throw line in the fourth, the Argylls finished 10-of-12, with Greene making six of her eight opportunities.

"I'm just really proud of them bouncing back from Saturday to play like this tonight," Bradley said.

While Madison-Grant only shot 17-of-50 for the game, they kept the Alexandria offense in check all evening, allowing just 15 field goals in 41 chances and forcing 17 Tiger turnovers. VanBlair led the Tigers with 18 points, while Jada Stansberry scored 10 points, all in the second half.

The Argylls' attention now turns to Sectional 39, where they will take on

In their final tune-up before sectionals begin, the Marion Giants ended the regular season with a loss, falling to Indianapolis Cathedral, 45-38, at the Bill Green Athletic Arena.

The Giants trailed 15-8

With 1:21 to play, Marion trailed by just four points at 41-37, but that was as close as the Giants would get, as the Irish finished the game with four of the last five points.

"I just felt like the urgency wasn't there, for whatever reason," Marion Head Coach Lawrence Jordan said. "We didn't pay attention to the details. It was a combination of things. I'm a little disappointed in the effort."

“We didn’t shoot the ball very well at all,” Eastbrook Head Coach Greg Allison said. “We were in

the 20 percent range from the field. We had a hard time guarding Brown. Those guys are tough. They’re solid. They’re a very solid basketball team, and they have some very good basketball players that we didn’t necessarily match up great against.”

Behind solid performances from Brown, who finished with 25 points, and shooting guard Brandon Stroble, who finished with 20, the Bruins built a 37-18 halftime lead and cruised in the second half, outscoring the Panthers 34-18 to secure the 35-point triumph.

“We competed. We played the gameplan the way we asked them to play,” Allison said. “We got good shots. They just didn’t really fall.”

Alex Baker led the Eastbrook offense with 12 points and eight rebounds in the loss.

Argylls fall to Bluffton

The Madison-Grant Argylls’ offensive woes continued on Saturday evening, as they fell behind by double digits early and never recovered in a 61-44 loss to the Bluffton Tigers.

The Argylls struggled mightily to put the ball in the basket in the first two quarters, knocking down just six of their 20 attempts. Bluffton took a 14-5 lead after the first quarter and increased that advantage to 27-16 at the halftime break.

“We are taking decent shots, we are just not hitting them,” Madison-Grant Head Coach Brian Trout said. “We had pretty good looks in the first half to night. We just could not hit anything.”

The Tigers kept their double-digit lead the rest of the way, as the Argylls were never able to find their groove offensively.

“We are just in a tough spot,” Trout said. “We’ve got some kids struggling with their game, and when



you are struggling with it mentally, it can be tough to perform. That’s where we are at right now. We have to figure out how to get the mental part of it before we can move on out of this black hole.”

Seth Lugar led the Argylls with 12 points in the loss.

Giants rout Logansport

Coming off of their tough loss to Lafayette Jefferson the weekend before, the Marion Giants found themselves back in the win column on Friday night, dominating the Logansport

The Giants scored early and often, building a 23-11 advantage after the first quarter of play and holding that double-digit lead the rest of the way.

Marion had four players finish in double figures. Rasheed Jones led the way with 21 points, Matthew Goolsby collected 16, JK Thomas finished with 14, and Jermaine Woods scored 10 in the Giants’ victory.

County Matchup

In a battle of two longtime rivals on Friday night, the Oak Hill Golden Eagles won their third straight, routing the Madison-Grant Argylls, 58-35.

“We were locked in on the defensive end of the floor early and often,” Oak Hill Head Coach Kevin Renbarger said. “I think as the [first] quarter went on and MG continued to struggle to get going, it gave us more confidence and created doubt for them on the other end of the floor.”

The Golden Eagles started quickly, building a 23-9 first-quarter lead, then turning up their defensive play over the next two quarters. Oak Hill shut out Madison-Grant in the second quarter and gave up just nine points in the third.

“We came out tonight and were basically a no-show,” Madison-Grant Head Coach Brian Trout said. “We battled for the first three or four minutes, and then they go on a 23-0 run to finish the half on us. We didn’t do anything offensively that we worked on all week. We just passed the ball around the perimeter and then settled for a three. You just aren’t going to win basketball games shooting 50 percent of your shots from three-point land. That was the difference.”

Tahj Johnson led the Golden Eagles with 13 points, while Grant Brown finished with nine points for the Argylls.

Giants defeat Fort Wayne Northrop

Despite trailing most of the contest, the Marion Giants found a way to win in the fourth quarter, taking the lead with under three minutes to go and holding on for a 63-60 triumph over Fort Wayne Northrop.

With the win, the Giants improved to 8-8 overall.

“I thought that we could come out and up-tempo the ball game early, but they actually executed well against our pressure,” Marion Head Coach James Blackmon said. “So we got behind. But our kids did a good job of keeping their composure and making the adjustments.”

“We made plays in the last two minutes of the third quarter to switch momentum. We got back-to-back threes, and we turned them over, so we took a 13-point lead and made it a six point lead heading into the fourth quarter. We put ourselves back in a situation to win it.”

JK Thomas led the way with 25 points, while Matthew Goolsby finished with 14 and Rasheed Jones collected nine.

Indians beat Alexandria

Playing in a hostile environment, the Mississinewa Indians, despite trailing by seven points heading into the final quarter, outscored the Alexandria Tigers 20-8 to come away with an 84-79 triumph.

With the victory, the Indians improved to 13-2 overall and 5-0 in conference play.

The two longtime conference rivals went back-and-forth throughout most of the first three quarters. The Indians led 24-23 after the first quarter and 52-50 at halftime, but the Tigers scored 19 points in the third quarter to build a 71-64 advantage.

“I thought our guys came out and played their game,” Mississinewa Head



Coach James Reed said. “We are going to get everybody’s best shot from here on out. [Alexandria] won their Madison County Tournament. They’re competitors. They’re strong athletes. They’re good basketball players. And they came ready to play.”

The Indians kept their composure, using a 12-0 run to regain the lead for good early in the fourth quarter. Defensively, the Indians held the Tigers to just four points in the first 6:04 of the period, which allowed them to pull away.

“Even though we played well, they matched us for three quarters,” Reed said. “They challenged us a little bit, but we’ve got some veteran players that didn’t freak out [and] knew to stay the course in a hostile environment. We figured it out there at the end of the game.”

In their home contest against the Lapel Bulldogs on Saturday evening, the Oak Hill Golden Eagles trailed only four times.

The first came after Lapel’s opening possession of the first quarter.

The second came at the 4:26 mark of the fourth quarter.

The third came just a few moments after that.

The fourth, and final, time came in the waning seconds, and it culminated in a heartbreaking loss.

After a strong first quarter and a double-digit halftime lead for the Golden Eagles, the Bulldogs came roaring back in the second half, and Kolby Bullard’s triple with 5.3 ticks to go handed Oak Hill a gut-wrenching 49-48 loss.

Bullard, one of Lapel’s best shooters, was halfway between the sideline and the three-point line when he released the eventual game-winning shot, but he found nothing but twine.

JB says the Marion-Northrop history still affects play today

If you were at the Bill Green Athletic Arena Saturday night, you might have wondered why the Giants battle with Ft. Wayne Northrop got a little out of control.

If you are new to the history of Marion Giant hoops, here's a quick history lesson on the Bruins and the Giants:

In 1974, in just their third year of existence, Northrop won the state title, led by the duo of Walter Jordan and Mike Muff. Bob Dille coached the Bruins to that title and it would be 11 long years until the Bruins played at that level of high school hoops again.

So, we fast forward to the 1985-86 season, in which the Giants and Bruins were ranked number one and number two in the state of Indiana. The game was to be played at Northrop, but with officials expecting thousands of fans to watch the best two teams in the state, the game was moved to the Ft. Wayne Memorial Coliseum.

Now I know you won't believe this—I promise, this is no Brunner-ism—but 10,000 fans packed the Coliseum that night. Marion won on a free throw by Daric Keys, 64-63. The best part of the story: we had the biggest snowfall of season that night and more than 5,000 Marion fans made it up to watch the number one-ranked Giants beat the Bruins by 1.

Everyone waited for the rematch in the semi state; that's all we could talk about. Well, the rematch never happened.

A young but talented Michigan City Rogers team that went unbeaten in 1984 only to be shocked by Al Rhodes and Warsaw (after beating Marion in the 1984 semi-state) thought they could win it all in 1985. They took Northrop out, and when Marion beat defending state champion Warsaw, we had a semi-state, with Marion winning 83-72. Marion won the state championship the next week, the only Giants team to finish off a perfect season.

So now it was 1986 and the Bruins couldn't wait to play Marion. On another cold night in January they came to the Bill Green Arena and beat the Giants, 77-75. It would be "the dream team's" only home loss, ever. The Bruins celebrated like they had won the state title that night.

In the morning regional game Marion got revenge, beating the Bruins, 79-72, in a game where Marion had to come from way behind late to win. That night Kyle Persinger hit a free throw with no time left for the Giants to beat Michigan City Rogers, 83 to 82. Marion went to state and rolled over Southridge and Anderson by a combined 28 points.

The Bruins had another shot at Marion in 1987.

The Bruins hoped for one more chance at ending "Purple Reign," but they never got the chance—being upset by Penn while Marion rolled over Michigan City Rogers for the third year in a row, this time 95-83. That night Marion beat the Kingsmen, 97-62 and the 192 points scored by Marion is still a semi state record.

As you know, the Giants went on to "three-peat" and the Bruins went on to know one third of a century of frustration. They have never made it back to the semi state and still lament the '85, '86 and '87 seasons, where they were just not good enough to beat Marion.

So now you know why that game last week got so out of control, and why they just couldn't stand losing to the Giants again. There is just something about purple and gold playing orange and brown.

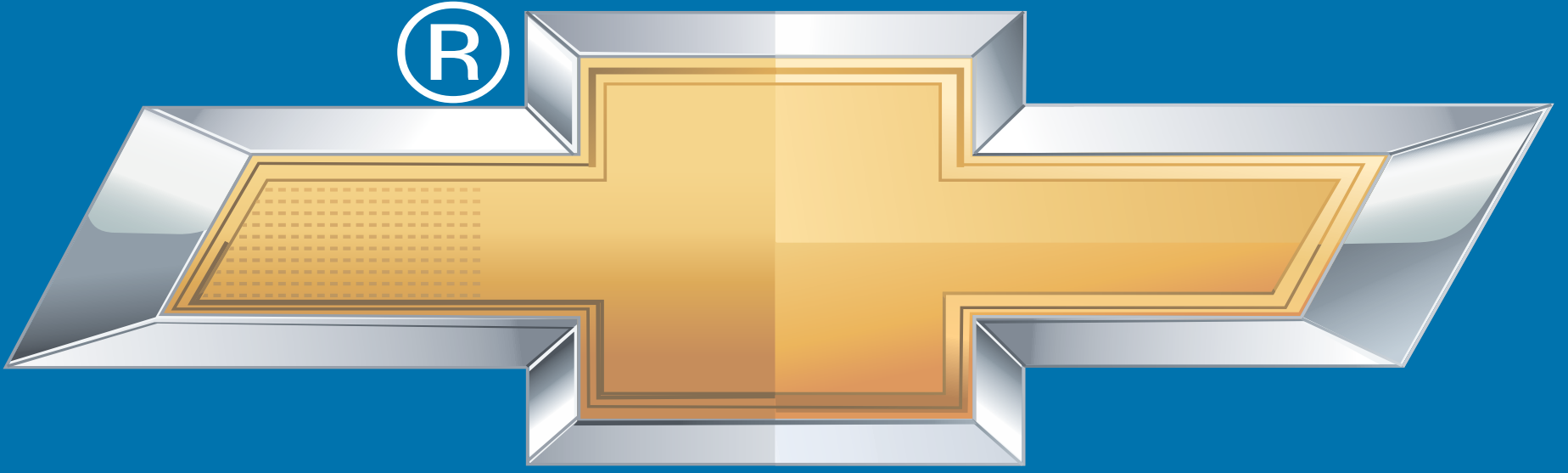
Mississinewa fought to regain the lead, but a few crucial giveaways in the guts of the game helped to secure Frankton's seven-point triumph.
