Hoeskma said. “We are still working through that piece.”

Any special needs student who elects to receive remote instruction via Giant Online Academy will continue to receive instruction that meets the individual needs of the student, as outlined in the student’s IEP.

All of those taking part in the Giant Online Academy will be expected to keep up with their assignments, attend all scheduled Google Meets, respond to feedback, and complete homework assignments and projects in a timely and efficient manner.

Attendance will be taken



daily for both onsite and online students, and the grading policy will be the same for both methods.

“We will try to keep the learning as consistent with on-campus learning as possible, with the same skills

the option will remain to return to onsite learning.

Those who want to switch to online learning will not be able to do so until August 24 or later, and depending on when the request is made, and for the safety of other students, there may be a specific waiting period of a week or more so that arrangements can be made.

“The students will be allowed to do both,” Lindsay said. “We ask families to work with us for the re-entry timeline. At the beginning of the year, we are asking for about three weeks. If you start off the year online, it would be after Labor Day before they

would be allowed back. We are trying to get the year up and going, so we ask for people’s patience with us.”

No matter which method of instruction students choose, whether it be onsite or online learning, Lindsay and Marion Community Schools plan to provide their students the best education possible during these difficult times.

“Our goal is the continuity of learning throughout these COVID times we live,” Lindsay said. “Both on-campus and at home through our Giant Online Academy, we will deliver robust, future-ready instruction for our Marion Giants.”
