Those who want to switch to online learning will not be able to do so until August 24 or later, and depending on when the request is made, and for the safety of other students, there may be a specific waiting period of a week or more so that arrangements can be made.

"The students will be allowed to do both," Lindsay said. "We ask families to work with us for the reentry timeline. At the beginning of the year, we are asking for about three weeks. If you start off the year online, it would be after Labor Day before they

would be allowed back. We are trying to get the year up and going, so we ask for people's patience with us."
