Hebrews 11:8-10

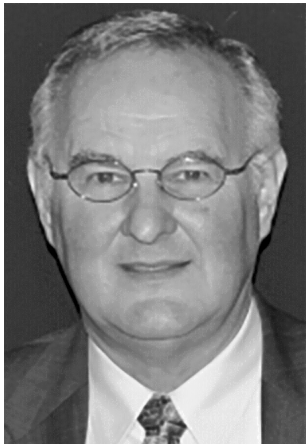
Several months ago we began a study on the heroes of the faith in Hebrews eleven. Little did we know that we would be faced with a virtual lockdown because of COVID-19. I sometimes wonder when picking material for messages if they are the right thoughts, but there is no doubt about this one. It is amazing how the Lord leads us in things we know nothing about. Now, bear in mind, Hebrews eleven deals with the invisible and the impossible. Each of the Bible characters are interesting studies. They all have one thing in common, they were common people with great faith.

Today we want to look at the life of Abraham. Like each of the others, Abraham was given an unbelievable task. In Genesis twelve, we read that God wants Abraham to leave Ur. He tells him, "Get thee out" (Genesis 1:1). Remember, God's timing is always perfect. Abraham has just lost his father Terah, and the Lord knows this is the time to act in Abraham's life. The faith exhibited by Abraham in his obedience to the Divine call of God is amazing. It wasn't because of the poverty, restless discontent, monotony of daily life, or persecution. The

reason was Divine command.

As God instructed him, He told Abraham that life would never be the same. He would lead him to "The Promised Land." Abraham didn't have a clue where he was going, but he knew that God was leading, and it was time to go. It can be a scary time in life if the Lord is leading and we don't know where. This represents a great principle that we all need to realize - we are not in charge. Life is easy when it goes our way, but that is not always God's plan. We see Abraham

packing up and heading out, by faith.

As we try to see the big picture, we see the result of Abraham's faith. First, let's see the work of Abraham's faith. What did he have to give up to follow the Lord? He would have to give up family, familiar environment, and his home. It was a moment of decision. It had to be Ur, his present place, or obedience. Has the Lord ever brought you to a moment of decision?

Secondly, we must see what life would be like if Abraham obeyed the Lord. He would have to leave his life of ease to live in a tent. He would be nomadic. Basically, he would have to leave his comfort zone. Most of us struggle when we are taken out of our comfort zone.

Thirdly, what would Abraham's life be lived for? He would spend his life looking for a city. It would be a city not built by man, but it would be built by God. What is the hope we have in Christ? Aren't we living this life in search of a city? Jesus said in John 14, "I go to prepare a place for you." What a promise!

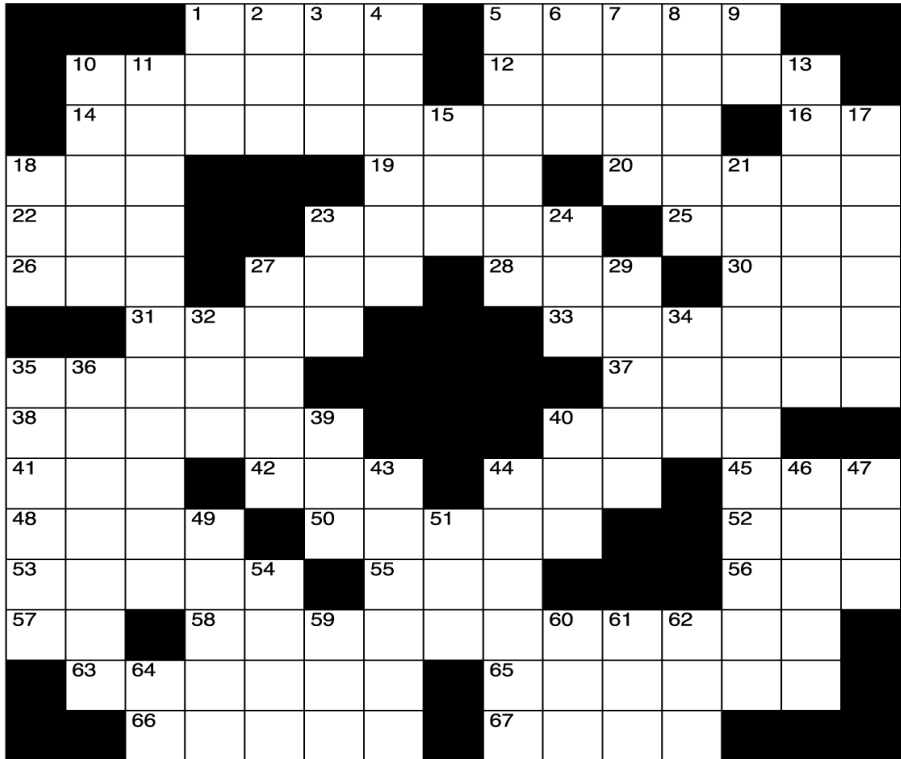
Abraham was willing to leave all behind to do the will of his Lord. He was prepared for risk and loss. He gave up the present for

Sudoku puzzles are formatted as a 9x9 grid, broken down into nine 3x3 boxes. To solve a sudoku, the numbers 1 through 9 must fill each row, column and box.
