

'Listening to our Watershed Soundscape' program to be held at Salamonie Lake Oct. 17

The public is invited to join Kay Westhues for an evening workshop, "Listening to our Watershed Soundscape," on Oct. 17, 6:30 - 8:30 p.m., at Salamonie Lake.

The program begins with DNR's interpretive naturalist Cassie Kennedy with Sound Bites at 6:30 p.m., where participants will hear and learn about nature's sounds. The workshop continues at 7:30 p.m. with an evening stroll and soundwalk at Salamonie Lake's Lost Bridge West

SRA. Guests will listen and record the park's night sounds using provided digital recording equipment. The recorded sounds will be added to the World Listening Day sound-scape map that will be available online.

Children under age 12 should be accompanied by an adult.


This is a free event made possible by the "Arts in the Park" grant through the IAC, ISPM, and DNR.
