Vaccine impacts cases in Grant County, second COVID-19 vaccines to be administered soon

Marion General Hospital, the Grant County Public Health Department, and the Grant County Emergency Management Agency gave their final COVID-19 update of 2020 on Wednesday, Dec. 30, discussing the success of the first round of vaccinations, as well as what to expect in the early stages of 2021.

According to Grant County EMA director Bob Jackson, the number of cases in the community are down. On Wednesday, there were 52 confirmed new cases, and over the past week, there were 94, down

from numbers they've had in previous weeks.

However, the month of December provided the highest numbers of cases in all of 2020, and Jackson expects there to be a surge after the New Year due to the Christmas holiday. With this in mind, Jackson and his team are taking the time to restock, resupply, and prepare themselves for another potential wave of

"We are taking this time to rebuild, rejuvenate, and be prepared for the next surge, should that come, and most likely, it will," Jackson said. "Everything that has gone on, and what we know from the past, predicts that we will see another one. We are preparing for that as best as we can, and we will move forward should that happen."

In more positive news, the administration of the COVID-19 vaccine has gone splendidly, according to several Marion healthcare providers.

At Marion General Hospital, after seven days of vaccination, approximately 900 doses have been administered. People diagnosed with COVID-19 have dropped since the vaccine became available, and admittance to the hospital has also decreased, according to MGH representative Sarah Seward.

Additionally, the B'MAB treatment, which is geared towards older patients who have COVID-19 symptoms but not serious enough to require hospitalization, has also been successful. Of the 60 patients who have used the treatment, 58 have fully recovered.

While the vaccine is still in its early stages, all signs point to an effective treatment of the COVID-19

"We are just continuing to monitor it," Seward said. "We are going to be about two weeks ago from our healthcare providers getting

their second dose of the vaccine. We are anxious to see what happens, if people have any kind of symptoms or anything like that. But so far, those of the healthcare providers that have received the vaccine have had minimal to no side effects from the first dose. So that's encouraging."

Grant County Public Health Nurse Amber Turner announced that the Health Department will be establishing a vaccine clinic of their own in the next few weeks. Training will begin in the near future, and information regarding the new clinic will be released to the public once it becomes

available.

"It's really a day by day [process] in here," Turner said. "We learn a little bit of something new every day."

While the vaccine is still being administered in healthcare facilities and to healthcare workers only, the belief is that it will be readily available to the public in the next few weeks, according to Jackson.

"Once that is complete, I personally visualize them taking over some of that for the public as well," Jackson

The next meeting will take on place on Thursday, Jan. 7, beginning at 3:30
