Eastbrook girls gasketball team wins first Grant Four title in five years

Throughout his nine-year career at the helm of the Eastbrook girls basketball program, Jeff Liddick's philosophy has remained the same. Success on the hardwood starts

The Panthers have taken pride in that facet of their game throughout the 2020-2021 season, and it was the major factor in their 50-27 triumph over Oak Hill Wednesday night in the Grant Four Championship — their first county tournament victory in five years

After a closely contested first half, the Panthers dominated the final two quarters, holding the Golden Eagles to just nine points, one in the fourth quarter, and three total field goals, all of which came in the third stanza.

"I have to give the girls all the credit for stepping up to the challenge that we set forth for them. To hold them to nine points in a half is pretty amazing," Liddick said.

As the second half progressed, the Panthers ramped up their defensive intensity, keeping the Oak Hill offense grounded and forcing the Golden Eagles into a plethora of mistakes, which allowed them to pull away.

However, the Golden Eagles did not do themselves any favors by turning the ball over 13 times in the second half and 21 times overall, many of which were unforced.

The first quarter was tightly contested, with neither team leading by more than two possessions in the opening eight minutes. Eastbrook opened the scoring with a pair of buckets in the paint from Kristin Goff, and Carlee Biddle answered with four points of her own to twice but Oak Hill ahead by two.

However, freshman Olivia Howell gave the Panthers the lead back for good in the final 23 seconds, converting on a three-point play to make it a 9-8 Eastbrook advantage after one.

The Panthers used a 10-0 run in the first four minutes of the second quarter to build a 19-8 lead, which included a pair of threes from freshman shooting guard Sophia Morrison, a jumper from Goff, and a score off a steal from Howell.

However, the Golden Eagles pushed back, ending the first half on a 10-4 run, including a three at the buzzer from Audrey Leak, to cut Eastbrook's advantage to 23-18.

Feeling that his team suffered a few defensive lapses and breakdowns late in the first half, Liddick challenged them to go all out on the defensive end on every possession.

And the message was heard loud

"I felt like the execution and the effort was inconsistent," Liddick said. "I challenged them...to go out on both ends of the court, make them hate to guard you, and then, when you're on the defensive end, make them hate being guarded. I thought we did a great job of that in the second half'

A contributing factor to the Pan-

thers' staunch defensive play was the performance of junior Lily McLaughlin. Primarily a JV player, McLaughlin earned varsity minutes after a stellar performance in the JV Grant Four Championship, in which

she scored 30 of the Panthers' 50

From the moment she stepped on the court, the energy level was immediately raised. The Panthers began to execute better, and their defensive play drastically improved. Though she only scored three points, she also came away with five rebounds, along with several

steals in crucial situations.

"We've been wanting Lily to do that all season long," Liddick said. "We knew she was capable of giving us minutes like that at the varsity level all season long. I told her before the game, 'You are going to get an opportunity here. I want you to play with the same confidence and the same intensity that you played with in the JV championship.' When she came in, the bench was super excited for her. Her teammates on the floor fed off of that, and she gave us a big lift."

Eastbrook built a 38-26 lead after

the third quarter and outscored the Golden Eagles 12-1 in the final frame to secure the victory.

Morrison, after scoring just nine points in the Panthers' semi-final against Mississinewa, put together a strong performance against Oak Hill, scoring 16 points, including all of Eastbrook's three-point attempts. Howell finished the game with seven points and five rebounds, while Goff, Johwen McKim, and Sehdah McKim each added six points.

For Oak Hill, Biddle led the way with seven points, while Treniti Thurman and Joy McDivitt each scored five.

Now, the work continues.

"If we can find some consistency, we will be pretty tough going into tournament time," Liddick said. "Hopefully, that's the point we get to here over the next four to four and a half weeks."

of the second half to put the Indians up by 10. Swanner, who was essentially a non-factor in the December 18 matchup, was all over the floor on Tuesday night, leading the Indians with 19 points, eight of which came in the third quarter.

"I couldn't be more proud of the consistency that we had as a team tonight," Reed said. "There were very few moments that we let up."

Tuesday night's loss was the first for Madison-Grant, who had entered the contest with an unblemished 7-0 record. However, despite the defeat, Cherry was proud of his team's tenacious effort and their unflagging growth — both consistently on display in each passing game.
