building on Pennsylvania Street, then moved it to the Amvets Post at 37th Street and the Bypass. Two months ago

he was given access to the building that is being transformed into the Proud Americans Veterans Warehouse. “It’s like walking

into a grocery store there,” said Hobby Moon, another veterans activist who has been assisting Turner. During the darkest days of the Covid pandemic Tyson Foods began distributing poultry to veterans groups who were doing food distributions. Several were conducted in Marion with help from Veterans Service Offi-

cer Brad Hodson. They were originally done at the Marion National Guard Armory. They are now being done at the Adams street location, with excess food being forwarded to

church organizations. The Veterans Warehouse does not yet have freezer facilities, so perishable foods have to go out the same day they come in.

The center is open Tuesday through Friday from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day. Veterans’ identification is required from patrons.
